Mathematics at Heaton, Susan Rogers

Identification of students' needs

Mathematics teaching and learning at Heaton is based around each student's needs and begins by identifying where students are. Before coming to Heaton, Year 6 students sit our mathematics entrance test. This gives us an initial picture of your child's strengths and weaknesses as well as helping us to identify students for further testing to go into our mathematics extension class. We have both a Year 7 and a Year 8 extension class, and these classes are taught by Mrs Rachel Bates three mornings a week.



In addition to the Heaton entrance test, early in the year students sit a number knowledge test (IKAN) which is a graded, timed test designed to find strengths, weaknesses and stages in such areas as fractions, place value and basic facts. This test is repeated twice more during the year so progress can be monitored. Each student receives a record sheet with their results so they know what areas they need to work on.

For each of the three domains of number (addition and subtraction, multiplication and division, and proportions and ratios) all students sit a pre and post test to help identify their stages and methods of solving different types of questions. Along with teacher observations, class work, and other assessments all this information helps us to build up a picture of your child's achievement and next learning steps.

Curriculum coverage

Heaton follows the Numeracy Project with the number and algebra strand taking up approximately half the year. Students achieving below stage 7 (level 4) have a greater emphasis on number than students achieving at stage 8 (level 5). As students move up through the stages, the time spent on addition and subtraction reduces, while the time on multiplication and division, and proportions and ratios increases. For this reason, the Year 7s, on average, will spend more time on addition and subtraction than Year 8s.

Each term has a component of number and one other strand (geometry, measurement, and statistics and probability). This term, most classes began with statistics, which is topical with the recent census. As we move into the second half of the term, Year 7s are mainly focusing on addition and subtraction, while Year 8s will be working on multiplication and division.

Presenting mathematical ideas in real life contexts and problem solving are integral parts of the programme. Students are encouraged to explain and justify their ideas, ask questions and explore their ideas. The development of number knowledge sits alongside this so students become confident in, for example, their basic facts. The use of Mathletics assists students with practising some of these important skills.

Mathletics

Every student has their own login and as a parent, you can receive a weekly report emailed to you if you sign up (free) on the Mathletics website. (You will need your child's login and password to do this.) There are different areas to the site. Live Mathletics is a great place for your child to practise their recall of basic facts and increase their speed. With ten levels, there is plenty of scope for all students. Teachers are able to monitor each student's progress in both this area and the activities section. Activities can be set by each teacher that relate to topics being covered in class, focus on areas that need additional practise or provide further opportunities for extension.
