Fifth Grade Expectations

- Students need to <u>be on time every day</u>.
 Students should be lined up and in the gym at 7:50 am.
- If your child is absent, please contact the office. Students are responsible for making up any missed work. I will place a "While you were out" sheet on students desks with any work they missed from the day.



- Any work missed by a student during the day due to music lessons, ESL, speech, nurse visits, etc. must be completed. The student is expected to check the board and speak with me to see what they missed.

 guide on their test.
- Students may bring a snack each day. See attached list of acceptable snacks.
- Each student is required to have a library card.
- Fifth grade students write a <u>five-page report on a United</u>
 <u>States president</u>. This paper is started before Winter Break in December and will be due in May. Students will need to go to the public library and do research at home to complete this report. The paper must be typed. Some time will be given at school to work on this project, but the majority of this paper will be completed at home.

Homework Policy



- Students will receive homework every night
- Reading 20 minutes at home is <u>ALWAYS</u> homework.
 - Students will have a reading log that parents will need to sign each night to keep track of how much their child is reading
- Homework is due <u>one</u> day after it is assigned
- Homework will only be accepted up to one day late for a reduced grade
- If students do not complete their homework, they will miss their lunch recess
- If a student repeatedly does not complete their homework, they will receive a Friday detention
- Homework will be recorded in your child's assignment notebook. Please check your child's assignment notebook to make sure they have completed all their work.








Classroom Rules

• January: Realistic Fiction


• February: Historical Fiction
