From I-81 in VA, take exit 279 on Stony Creek Blvd. Turn east toward Edinburg. After crossing railroad tracks, turn left onto Printz St., then right onto Piccadilly. Go one block and turn left onto High St.

The Heritage Center is a white (former church) building on left, in the middle of the block. The event entrance is on the right side of building. The handicap ramp is on the left side of building.

Parking is available in the Shentel lot with driveway directly across from the Center. Additional space is available in the lot at the corner of Piccadilly & High St. (across from Methodist Church).
