Reminder regarding 4-H enrollment status:

We still have many youth in the 4-HOnline systems that remain in PENDING status. PENDING is <u>not</u> enrolled and youth that continue to have enrollment that is listed as PENDING are <u>not</u> eligible for 4-H club other 4-H sponsored events or activities. Typically PENDING status is a result of nonpayment of the \$10 4-H participation fee or the request of free/reduced lunch scholarship.

I am asking that volunteers continue to be diligent, making sure that the enrollment /re-enrollment process is accomplished. ACTIVE status is the only indicator of a completed enrollment. Here in the office we will also continue to remind families via email to complete enrollment from PENDING to ACTIVE status. If families believe their PENDING status is in error, they should contact the office.


FAIR NOTES

Fair Checks—If you have not cashed your 2015 Fair or Livestock check, please do so as soon as possible. If you have checks from 2014 or before, please send the check back to the Treasurer at the Fair Office at P.O. Box 325, Marysville, Michigan 48040 and a check will be re-issued.

<u>New for 2016</u>

- Still exhibit premiums have been increased to \$4 for a blue rating ribbon and \$2.50 for a red rating ribbon. The goal is to increase the number of exhibitors participating in still exhibit project areas.
- New Dog Project class called Nose Work; more information to come
- Market hog max weights have been increased 220-300 lbs. Anything over or under those weights will be shown in an underweight or overweight class. Underweight hogs will not be sold as in previous years. Overweight hogs will be sold at the end of sale.
- Market goat exhibitors will be allowed to tag two market goats, but only one will be allowed to exhibit at the fair.
- 2016 Livestock Sale order = Sheep, Beef, Goats, Veal, Rabbits, Poultry and Swine

This five-day precollege program is offered in partnership with Michigan 4-H Youth Development (<u>http://4h.msue.msu.edu</u>), Michigan State University (MSU) Department of Animal Science (<u>http://www.ans.msu.edu</u>) and MSU College of Veterinary Medicine (<u>http://cvm.msu.edu</u>).

At this fun and interactive camp, participants will:

- Engage in numerous hands-on learning activities, ask questions and problem solve.
- Gain animal-handling experience.
- Have the opportunity to visit and explore MSU farms and facilities.
- Work their way through a veterinary science case study as a team and create a presentation to be critiqued by veterinarians.
- Explore various animal-related career fields while reflecting on their experiences and community programs.

Who: Participants must be ages 13 to 16 as of January 1, 2016.
