

From the Desk of the Parish Director

♦ This past week, I participated in the annual conference of the Midwest Pastoral Administrators, which consists parish pastoral leaders who are appointed by the (arch) bishop for the pastoral care of parishes without a resident priest pastor under the provision of canon 517.2. While the group consists mainly of Parish Directors from the Midwestern states, participation is open to all Parish Directors throughout the United States and Canada. The annual conference began in 1986, approximately four years after the first Parish Directors were appointed in Wisconsin and Minnesota. Membership has grown exponentially since then Current rough estimates number approximately 550 Parish Directors in the United States.

Throughout our country, there are various titles given to what our archdiocese names "Parish Directors." In several (arch)dioceses, they are named "Pastoral Administrators." Others are referred to as "Ecclesial Ministers." Regardless, the defining factors are 1) the appointment by the (arch)bishop and 2) the provision of canon 517.2 which allows for the pastoral care of a parish "to be entrusted" to a layperson or a deacon.

Here in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, there are currently nine Parish Directors who serve ten parish communities—Jan Ruidl at St. John Nepomuk in Racine; Dan Hull at St. James in Franklin; Deacon Mike Burch at St. Peter Claver in Sheboygan; Brenda Cline at St. Joseph in Grafton; Tom McKenna at St. Catherine in Sharon; Deacon Stan Lowe at St. John the Evangelist in Twin Lakes and St. Alphonsus in New Munster; Debbie Hintz at St. Catherine of Alexandria in Milwaukee;

Deacon Richard Pionek at St. Mary's Elm Grove; and me. Since 1994, when the first Parish Directors were appointed by Archbishop Weakland, the number of Parish Directors has fluctuated from four to nine, depending on pastoral need. Parish Directors have been appointed by all three archbishops since 1994–Weakland, Dolan, and Listecki.

A Parish Director led parish is one of the six models of pastoral leadership proposed in the pastoral planning document "Parishes and Pastoral Leadership 2020." (A copy of this document is available by request to Heather Goeden in the Parish Office.) Note that in the above listing of parishes and Parish Directors are urban, suburban, rural, and city parishes. Some have parish or consolidated schools and cemeteries; parish membership ranges from 200 households to 2000 households. The Parish Director model has proven effective for a wide range of parishes.

Next Weekend is Sharing Weekend

Our Sharing Recipient for this month is Meta House It is an internationally-recognized drug and alcohol abuse treatment program for women, and has been providing long-term, gender-responsive treatment since 1963. The innovative and holistic services offered at Meta House help women stop using alcohol and drugs. Women also learn to overcome a host of other barriers such as poverty, unemployment, homelessness and/or unsafe housing, parenting, poor physical health, mental health disorders, and past physical, emotional and sexual abuse.

Knowing that the women served at Meta House want to be good mothers, in 1988 our facility became one of the first in the nation to include children in the residential treatment setting. By including children, Meta House is able to provide comprehensive services to counteract the affects of maternal substance use and to break the cycle of addiction. It is estimated that for every dollar invested in treatment for drug or alcohol addiction, taxpayers save at least \$7.46 in costs to society – costs like emergency room visits, disability payments, criminal justice activity, and financial assistance.
