Parent-Teacher Conferences

This Friday, student progress reports are being mailed out to all of the Elementary parents. In the envelope we've included a schedule for Parent-Teacher Conferences. The conferences take place on the 12th and 13th November. These conferences are scheduled twice during the school year, each fall and spring, to exchange ideas about your child's activities, habits, experiences and achievements. We strongly encourage all parents to take advantage of this opportunity to discuss their children. If

you would like to make additional conferences with any of the specialist teachers, please call Mary Rayne.

A list of suggestions to make the most of these conferences, compiled by a group of teachers and parents several years ago, is listed in this article. Prior to the conferences, parents are encouraged to send in to teachers any questions or topics they particularly want to discuss.

A TEAMWORK APPROACH TO PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

- Plan Ahead. Make notes of what you want to discuss before the meeting. If you have an issue to discuss, make an effort to inform the parent/teacher prior to the conference, so that there are no uncomfortable surprises.
- Work Together. Talk about concerns in a positive, problem-solving manner. Keep an open mind to suggestions.
- Involve your child/student. Open communication between parents, teachers and students is the foundation of an effective partnership. An important goal is to promote student ownership for learning.
- W ork towards Understanding. Ask questions, rely on facts and avoid blaming each other. Share Relevant Information. Discuss major changes that have occurred or been observed. Focus on present skills & future progress.
- Stay on Schedule. Arrive, start and end on time. Remember you only have 15 minutes for this conversation!
- Create an Action Plan. Summarise the main points discussed and steps agreed upon to encourage the continued progress of the child. The goal is to establish a plan to support the child.
- Respect Each Other. Remember there are at least two experts at the table: the expert on this child (parent) and the expert on education for children this age or in this subject (teacher).
- Celebrate Success. Show appreciation for the efforts of the child and for the encouragement and work of each other. Let your child/student know that you value an ISA partnership.

After the conference...

Be Responsible

At ISA parents, teachers and students are expected to discuss questions/concerns in a timely manner throughout the school year. All parties should follow through with actions discussed, allowing for additional communication as needed.

It's wonderful that so many of our students participate in the after-school activities. Please remember, however, that the one condition for participation is that students must be *formally* signed-up prior to joining an activity. Attendance is taken at the activities and parents will be phoned if students show up who haven't registered or fail to attend some activity they have signed-up for. During the last school year the PTO gave funds through the Enrichment Programme to the Science Department for improvements to the pond. The following is an update from Dr Carmichael.

"I wanted to give you and the PTO an update on the pond following your generous donation towards improving the area.

The pump has made the water much cleaner and produced a healthier environment for the fish. As well as filtering the water, the drop back in aerates the water, which is putting life back into the pond. We have purchased some aquatic plants that are thriving. There is also a small willow tree and the gardener has made plans to replant the area to encourage more invertebrates. This planting will take place in the spring and we will buy the remaining plants then.

Next semester we will be able to promote the space as an interesting ecosystem and invite more classes to make use of the area. At the moment, the pond water and elodea are very useful to chemistry and biology classes respectively.

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
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
