Avery is a native Georgian who settled in the Dayton area after retiring from the United States Air Force as a Colonel in 2001. Avery holds degrees from the University of Georgia, Webster University, the Air War College and The Iliff School of Theology. While at Iliff, she served as a hospital chaplain at a Denver Level 1



Trauma Center and as a student pastor at a rural United Methodist Church. She is currently pursuing ordination in the United Church of Christ.

This will be a different topic from the one he does at the state meeting.

Ron is a lay person with a thorough background in Bible study. His eclectic history includes Presbyterian, Baptist, Christian & Missionary Alliance and United Methodist. The father of a gay son, he is active in both PFLAG and GLSEN.

State PFLAG Meeting

PFLAGers from all over Ohio will be heading to the Lima Veteran's Memorial Civic and Convention Center on Saturday, April 14th, for the annual PFLAG state meeting. With breakfast and registration beginning at 8:00 a.m., the day's schedule will begin at 9:00 and conclude at 4:00.

A jam packed agenda includes speakers, panels, and break-out sessions with presenters who are well-qualified to address a variety of topics. They include: grants and fundraising, gender/sexual identity, family issues, and advocacy. All this costs just \$15 which includes breakfast and lunch.

There will be a casual, low key meet-and-greet on Friday evening for people who arrive the day before. Special room rates have been arranged at the Wingate Hotel (<u>www.limawingate.com</u>) which is adjacent to the Convention Center. It's PFLAG Scholarship Time

Each year PFLAG Dayton awards at least two \$2000 scholarships. One is presented to an outstanding student who is LGBT, and one goes to an accomplished straight ally. The Jim Wilger Memorial Straight Ally Scholarship is to honor the contributions of a strong straight ally who worked diligently for PFLAG Dayton for many years.

Students who are enrolled in any accredited postsecondary institution of higher learning may apply for PFLAG Dayton scholarships. This includes traditional four year colleges and universities, community colleges, vocational schools and specialized institutions such as seminaries and medical schools. Previous PFLAG scholarship recipients have represented all of these kinds of advanced education.

The scholarship committee, chaired by Jan Couchman, takes into account the usual factors – grades, extracurricular activities and recommendations from teachers, employers, or community leaders. Additionally, they consider the student's involvement in activities that benefit or advocate for LGBT people and their issues.

The scholarship application is available on the PFLAG Dayton website <u>www.pflagdayton.org</u>. Both applications and supporting documents must be postmarked no later than April 16th.

Again this year, PFLAG Dayton will administer a \$1000 scholarship for the Greater Dayton LGBT Center. It will be awarded to an LGBT student, and the application process is the same as for PFLAG Dayton scholarships.

Marriage in Maryland & Washington

Governor Martin O'Malley recently signed the marriage equality bill in Maryland to go into effect January 1, 2013. Washington state also recently passed marriage equality; effective in six months. Legal challenges to both are expected.

✔ Anti-transgender Bathroom Bill in Tenn.

Legislation pending in the Tennessee General Assembly would make it a criminal offense for transgender individuals to enter a bathroom designated for the sex not indicated on their birth certificates. Birth certificate gender markers cannot be changed in Tennessee.

Two States Get "Gay" License Plates

Indiana will be the first state in the nation to offer license plates promoting LGBT causes. The plates bear the logo of Indiana Youth Group, an organization promoting LGBT



tolerance in schools. State motor vehicle officials in South Carolina will offer

a specialty plate themed with South Carolina Equality's name and logo.

Gym Membership Reversal

Injured Iraq War vet Coty May and his husband Shane, married in Washington, D.C., originally were denied a family membership in a Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio, gym because their marriage wasn't "real." Gym facilities assist with Coty's recovery, and Shane is his caregiver. The gym later reconsidered, recognizing their family status.

Pro-LGBT Federal Housing Regulations

HUD is preparing to finalize new regulations forbidding discrimination based on sexual orientation or gender identity in housing programs administered or funded by the federal government.
