TROY COMMUNITY FARM

Troy Community Farm grows an abundant selection of **certified organic** produce on Madison's Northside. Established in 2001, the farm is the heart of Troy Gardens, a unique 31-acre urban development mixing green-built affordable housing with sustainable agriculture and restored natural areas.



D uring the growing season, farm members visit weekly to pick-up vegetable shares, cut fresh flowers, and enjoy the gardens, prairie, and woodlands that surround the farm. Members purchase a share in the early spring and, for 20 weeks, receive a selection of fresh, organic produce grown right here in Madison.

Members are welcome to join us on the farm, learn about organic vegetable production, and enjoy the summer sun during our volunteer workdays every Friday morning. Members are also invited spend a music-filled day at Troy Gardens during the Savor the Summer Festival in August.

MEMBERSHIP

How it works: Members join the farm by purchasing a vegetable share up front. Members then visit the farm weekly to pack their own vegetables from the harvest display. Our farmers and the newsletter guide members through the process each week. Pickups are on Thursdays from 4:00 to 6:30 PM, and our 2011 season runs from June 2nd to October 13th, with a likely bonus pickup on the 20th.

Share size: We offer one standard share size, which is designed to feel plentiful, but not overwhelming. Each share has between 6 and 8 vegetables in the early season and between 8 and 12 in the later part. Members may split a share with friends or purchase multiple shares to suit their needs. Visit our website at www.communitygroundworks.org and click on "Troy Community Farm" to read newsletters and see photos of every share from the past six seasons.

Where to pick up shares: All our members pick up at Troy Gardens on the northside of Madison. We set up the CSA stand, as pictured below, at the entrance to the property in the 500 block of Troy Drive. See the map on the back panel to find Troy Gardens.
