



Today's Readings


First Reading — Whenever anyone who had been bitten by a serpent looked at the bronze serpent, they lived (Numbers 21:4b-9).

Being Lifted Up

In today's Gospel, Jesus reminds Nicodemus how Moses had "lifted up the serpent in the desert." Then Jesus says, "So must the Son of Man be lifted up, that all who believe may have eternal life in him." The evangelist clearly saw this "lifting up" of Jesus to mean his crucifixion.

That "lifting up" of the serpent by Moses is described in today's first reading. The people were attacked by "saraph serpents," and many died. God had Moses make an image of the serpent and put it on a pole and lift it up. The people who had been bitten looked at it and recovered.

Jesus "emptied himself, taking the form of a slave." Lifted up on the cross, he was despised and seemed the most abject of people. But it was in embracing this disgrace and painful death that he became the bearer of eternal life for all of us. His "lifting up" in shame was also his "lifting up" in glory and triumph.



As your summer comes to its inevitable completion and school routines begin to be put into place, please try to remember those in our community who depend on the local food banks to meet the basic needs for themselves and their families. This month we collected 47 bags of groceries. Marie was so very grateful to see the carts of bags roll in and she continually brags of the generosity of St. Bernard.

Our next collection is during the weekend of September 13th & 14th. They can use canned meats, tuna, jelly, peanut butter, juice boxes, etc. Could you put a bag together?

SHIP Update

St. Bernard collects casseroles and #10 cans of vegetables on the 2nd Sunday of every month in support of SHIP (Samaritan Homeless Interim Program). The next pick up is scheduled for September 14th.

Please consider preparing a casserole to help feed our neighbors in the community who are not able to provide full meals for their families. There are four recipes to choose from. Interfaith Hospitality Network

Please take the time to read through, we need you!

St. Bernard will be hosting the IHN homeless shelter program for the week beginning on September 14th.

Over the past year some of our long time volunteers for the program have stepped down from their involvement in the program due to moving from the area, work schedules and health issues.

We are at a point in this community outreach ministry where we need to evaluate if we are committed to continuing to support the shelter program. For the continued viability of this program at St. Bernard's, it is imperative that we enlist new families and individuals to volunteer their time to assist. We have been a part of this program since 1992 from its inception. At that time we had a much smaller congregation to draw volunteers from. Now in 2014, with a much larger parish, our volunteers have drastically dwindled and our support of this program that serves our local community is in jeopardy.

Commitments are hard to make given the very busy lives that many find themselves in. So what are we actually looking for from a volunteer in a given year? We currently are scheduled to host the program for five weeks in 2015.

- As an **overnight volunteer** on the 9:00 pm to 6:00 am shift, we would need you no more than five nights in the year, and most likely it would be four nights of the year.
- Overnight Host Coordinator. Bob Craig has organized the overnight hosts for the past several years and is going to step down at the end of 2014. We are in need of a coordinator who is willing to schedule the overnight volunteers.
- As an evening volunteer on the 5:00 pm 9:00 pm shift, we would need you no more than five nights during the year, and most likely it would be three to four nights. Cynthia O'Connor would contact you a week or two before the shelter begins to check on your availability. *This is a good opportunity for families to get their kids involved with volunteerism. Also for students in need of service hours whether it be for their high school, scouts, or for making confirmation, they with a parent can sign up to help host.*
- As a **cook** who helps to prepare the evening meal, the cooking team coordinator, Tracy Liston, would place you on a team (one team for each night Sunday through Thursday) and you would assist with part of the meal for that night four to five nights a year. The team leader for your night would let you know what is needed, you would prepare it and drop it off hot in the classroom near the parish office just before 6:00 pm.
- As a **baker** who is on the dessert team, you would need to bake maybe four times during the year. Our baking team leader, Barbara Landmann, would work with you on which night a dessert is needed.

In 2014 we found a partner in the Garretson Road Church of Christ in Bridgewater. They currently supply the volunteers for the Friday night 5:00 pm - 9:00 pm shift and prepare the evening meal as well. Additionally, one of their parishioners is one of the Saturday night overnight hosts for IHN throughout the entire year with the exception of 2-3 weeks.

IHN Host weeks for St. Bernard are as follows:

September 14, 2014; October 26, 2014; January 4, 2015; February 22, 2015; May 17, 2015; September 13, 2015; and November 8, 2015

The number one area of concern is with the overnight hosts. At this point we do not have enough volunteers to ensure that we always have two overnight hosts on each night of the week. This puts an unfair burden on the single person who is the overnight host. This would not be considered a "best practice" for any shelter program. If you can donate a handful of overnights in the coming year, please reach out to Bob Craig at: <u>bbcrg@optonline.net</u>. He can tell you more about what it entails and get you added to the volunteer list.

The Celebration of Christian Marriage

Arrangements with the Church for a wedding should be made approximately one year prior to the desired date. Participation in a Diocesan Pre-Cana program will assist couples in their preparation for the sacrament of Matrimony. Catholics who have been away from the Church and the Sacraments need to re-establish their Church and Sacramental life as a pre-requisite for marriage.
