Knight of the Month September 2011



Rev SK Thomas Ferguson

Father Thomas (Tom) Ferguson was born in Woodside, NY, on May 27, 1966. He is the oldest of six children of Mary Ann and Joseph Ferguson. After attending St. Sebastian School in Woodside, his family moved to Alexandria, and joined Good Shepherd Parish in 1978. Father Tom graduated from Bishop Ireton High School in 1984.

After graduating from Allentown College of St. Francis de Sales with a Bachelor's degree in Politics in 1987, he earned a Master's degree (in 1989) and a Doctorate (in 1991), in Government, both from the University of Virginia. He then entered Mount St. Mary's Seminary in Emmitsburg, MD, for theological studies. There he earned an M.A. and Master of Divinity in Theology in 1994. His diaconate assignment was at St. Mary Parish in Alexandria. Father Tom was ordained to the priesthood by the late Arlington Bishop John R. Keating on May 21, 1994. He served as Parochial Vicar at St. Bernadette Parish in Springfield from 1994-96.

From 1996 to 1998, Father Tom completed studies leading to a J.C.L. in Canon Law at St. Paul University in Ottawa, Canada. He was appointed in 1998 to the diocesan Tribunal while also serving as Parochial Vicar at St. Luke Parish in McLean.

Father Tom wrote a four-part story series on the history of the Church in Northern Virginia, which was published in the Catholic Herald in the summer of 1999. He is also the author of *Catholic and American: The Political Theology of John Courtney Murray*, published by Sheed and Ward in 1994.

He has served on several diocesan committees, including a term as Chairman of the Ecumenical and Interreligious Affairs Committee and the committee for the diocesan 25th anniversary celebration. He has served for twelve years as secretary and as a member of the Presbyteral Council. Father Tom is a member of the Board of Trustees of Mount St. Mary's University and the Loyola Retreat House in Faulkner, Maryland.

In 2002, Father Tom was named Administrator at St. Bernadette Parish in Springfield, where he served until 2004, when he was appointed Pastor of St. Thomas á Becket Parish in Reston. He was named a Judge on the Diocesan Tribunal in 2004. In 2008, he was appointed Episcopal Vicar for Faith Formation and Director of the Diaconate Formation Program.

Father Tom became the Pastor of Good Shepherd Catholic Church on June 29, 2011; he will continue serving as Episcopal Vicar for Faith Formation, Diocesan Judge and Director of the Diaconate Formation Program. Last month, Fr. Ferguson was named Friar for Potomac Assembly 2204.

Congratulations Fr. Ferguson!!







PRO-LIFE Report - October 2011

Watching more TV than I should, I lay before the idiot upheld similar proposals in South Carolina. But box on August 30th watching MSNBC denigrate Rick Perry because Texas had recently passed and he had signed a law mandating that abortion clinics discuss results of their sonograms with would-be patients. I asked my wife Sue "how long do you think that law will survive before a judge strikes it down." Later that same day came a news report that indeed the new law had been invalidated by a federal court.

A recent report from the prestigious British Journal of Psychiatry which studied almost a million women found that women who have had abortions have an 81% increased risk of mental health problems and 155% increased risk of suicide. You will not hear the main stream media covering this report and the abortion industry will not slacken its enthusiasm for abortion based on these findings; but there should be some increase in PRO-LIFE sentiment and behavior on the part of the general public.

In another study with life implications, researchers have found that women who take well-known painkillers such as celebrex, motrin, advil and aleve double their chances of having a miscarriage during their pregnancies. Pregnant women have a 15 percent chance of a "clinically detected" miscarriage -- one that occurs after a woman knows she is pregnant. But it's estimated that up to half of all fertilized eggs are miscarried, usually in the first seven weeks of pregnancy. Pregnant women and those seeking to become pregnant are urged to avoid taking these painkillers during pregnancy.

The medical board of the state of Virginia is currently revising its regulations on abortion clinics. Like the Texas law, this is an excellent way to reduce the number of abortions in our state. On September 15, the board voted 12-1 to require abortion clinics to meet safety standards that mandate additional requirements for medical staff, equipment and abortion clinic physical plant. (Five of the six members of the board appointed by former Governor Kaine voted for the new regulations. The only holdout was a businessman from Northern Virginia). The new regulations are supposed to go into effect on January 1. But I predict that the abortion industry will challenge these new regulations before the ink in dry. Delegate Bob Marshall has noted that the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 4th District in Richmond has

reading the abortion industry's reactions, one can feel the intense opposition to these new regulations because they may well reduce the number of abortions in Virginia. Stay tuned.

There were several letters to the editor about these draft regulations that I found particularly poignant "Who cannot see that there is a serious problem with the fact that 'about 25,000 abortions' were performed in Virginia last year......These are our children, our future.....think of the influence any of those 25,000 lives would have had in a family, a city, a state, our country, the world." When The Washington Post boasted that how safe abortions are, a reader noted that abortion procedures also have a 100% infant mortality rate. Not so safe for the babies. Please consider joining the Alexandria Life Chain on Sunday, October 2nd from 2:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. on Franconia Road between St. Lawrence Catholic Church and Frontier Avenue near Springfield Mall. Life chains consist of Christians quietly, prayerfully lining both sides streets with signs carrying PRO-LIFE messages. The signs can be picked up in the parking lot of the church. The next 40 Days for Life campaign kicks off on September 27 with a rally at Bishop Ireton High School which I will be attending.


