







Anyone, in effect, can be a mentor for a younger or less experienced employee, and the benefits of such a relationship accrue in both directions.

Organizational trends such as downsizing, restructuring, teamwork, increased diversity and individual responsibility for career development are contributing to the interest in mentoring. Downsizing in particular has heightened the need to preserve institutional memory and to share the information and experience that remain in the company. In a mentoring program, older, more experienced workers continue to contribute to their organizations and professions and provide the corporation valuable continuity.

Mentoring is a powerful way for younger professionals and employees to learn both personal and professional skills from the hardwon, real-life experiences of those with more seasoning and experience. It is an effective method for businesses to help employees with orientation, career advancement, problem solving, coaching and support, at little tangible cost. A good mentor can give perspective and sets expectations as to what is realistic and what is not. Like a good friendship, it requires care but results in mutual benefit. A good mentor takes considerable personal interest in cultivating an employee. Likewise, a good protegé who is not only willing but also eager to learn brings out the best in a mentor.

What we need to realize is a mentoring program can be an alternative to the career ladder and will provide security to all parties involved. Real estate companies and employees should welcome this infusion of new blood and fresh talent. It essentially is a win-win situation!

The manufacture of T-12 lighting ballasts has been stopped this year due to the everchanging requirements of the EPA. This decision was based on the push for energy conservation. The alternative is the T-8 or T-5 Electronic Ballast. The T-12 lamps will also be

discontinued. After the cut-off date, the only means of obtaining these type lamps will be from the remaining stock of the suppliers. With the existing demand for these lamps and the decreased supply, we can all count on a price increase on the remaining stock.

In summation, all new lighting installations will be required to be with electronic ballasts. Any existing buildings with the outdated T-12 lamps and ballasts can continue to operate, but eventually the supply of lamps will come to an end.
