In order to further enhance Student Leadership Skills our school has submitted the names of our School Captains and School Vice Captains to attend the Victorian Student Representative Council Primary Schools Conference. The Victorian Student Representative Council (VicSRC) is the peak body representing secondary students in Victoria.

They strive for an education system where learning is responsive to the needs of students, enjoyable, practical, meaningful, and where student voice is valued and supported. Creating these spaces for students to meet, express themselves and realise how much they have in common can be incredibly empowering. Our students will have the opportunity to network with other students and teachers in their region, learn how to be a more effective student representative and take action on issues they care about.

When our students return from this Conference they will present their findings to the staff and their peers and hopefully induct our additional school leaders with their knowledge and skills gained.

Feedback From Many Sources

The School receives feedback from a variety of sources including The Staff Opinion Survey, Student Attitudes to School Survey and the Parent Opinion Survey.

The Student Survey encompasses the areas of Student Relationships, Wellbeing and Teaching and Learning. It asks the students to rate their beliefs and opinions in these areas; Student Relationship includes Classroom Behaviour, Connectedness to Peers and Student Safety. The Wellbeing component includes Student Distress and Student Morale. The areas of Teaching and Learning incorporate questions related to Learning Confidence, School Connectedness, Stimulating Learning, Student Motivation, Teacher Effectiveness and Teacher Empathy.

Our trend data is extremely positive and well above the State Mean with all results in the fourth quartile and above the 95th percentile. As a staff we carefully monitor our student feedback and develop strategies to further improve programs and teaching and learning environments.

COMMUNICATION & ENGAGEMENT

One of our many goals for 2015 is to continue to strengthen the partnership between staff, the students and their parents. No doubt you will have noticed the increase in communication, along with the several opportunities to engage with the school. We have made some significant advancements in these areas and a letter detailing our initiatives will be sent home next week – we would love to hear your feedback.

This letter also details the specific links to our current notices and curriculum details which hopefully will make it easier for parental access.

It is my belief that our teachers are best focussing on their main task, which is educating our students developing greater learning outcomes for each individual.

This year I have engaged a 'PR/Communications Manager' to assist us with the development and implementation of a 'Communication and Engagement Strategy'.

Please note that Uniform Shop orders placed through Qkr before 9am will ensure same day delivery via the child, unless stock is unavailable. In this case a Backorder will be placed and we will endeavour to fill as soon as possible.

Car Parking

Staff Car Parks

In the interest of safety, parents and students are not permitted to access the school through the Staff Car parks on McDonald Street or Wood Street before or after school.

Staff car parks are out of bounds to all pedestrian and motor traffic other than to the staff themselves. There are two pedestrian paths access points either side of the staff car park on McDonald Street to facilitate SAFE entry to our school.

The staff car parks are also our Emergency Access points. They must be free to allow ambulance, fire trucks and other emergency vehicles entry at all times.

Two Minute Zone - "Kiss N Go"

There are two "Kiss N Go" zones on Wood Street where parents can quickly drop and collect their children within a two minute time frame.

This is not a parking area – you are not allowed to park for extended periods (no longer than 2 minutes), double park or leave your car and enter the school. If you need to walk your child into school, you must park in one of the surrounding streets, in a legal parking area (and not over driveways).

The times of operation for the two minute parking bays (as reflected by the signage) are 8.30am-9.15am and 3pm-4pm on School Days.

Please help us to keep our streets safe, by not causing congestion in the area of our School Crossing. This area is for the convenience of our whole school population; please think of others when you use this facility.

ORDERS DUE WEDNESDAY 11th MARCH

Great news, Book Club is going paperless and cashless! This year all orders will be paid by credit card – the school will no longer be accepting cash or cheques for Book Club orders.

Pamphlets went out this week for the first issue of Book Club for the year. For families new to the school, Scholastic Australia through their Book Clubs offer a wide variety of books, posters, games etc. suitable for Foundation to Year 6. We offer Book Club to the school community once or twice a term. Placing your order is easy. Please see below the instructions for placing your order.

How to order:

For a quick How to Order video, log in to <u>www.scholastic.com.au/LOOP</u> and click on HELP in the top menu and/or follow the instructions.

Log in to <u>www.scholastic.com.au/LOOP</u> (and follow the instructions on the home page that take you to the LOOP page) or download the Scholastic iPhone and iPad app from the App store.

Under the heading 'Parent Book Club Payment' enter State (Vic) and School name (BEAUMARIS NORTH).

Click on ORDER in the top menu or REGISTER first to save your details for next time.

Select State (Vic), Postcode (3193), BEAUMARIS NORTH and then START ORDER.

Select the relevant issue to make your order.

Click + to add a child and enter your child's first name, surname initial (so the school knows who the book is for) and select the appropriate Year Level and Class, then click ADD.

Enter the item number from the Book Club brochure (and quantity) and select NEXT to follow the payment prompts.

NOTE

You can order for multiple children at once if they attend Beaumaris North.

All orders are linked directly to the school for submission to Scholastic. Books will be delivered to your child's classroom if you order by the close date.

There is no need to return paper order forms or payment receipt details to the school.
