Principal's Report

Generation Next Conference

Dr Clifford recently attended the Generation Next Conference. This annual conference is for teachers, psychologists and health professionals and focuses on the mental health and wellbeing of our children. Dr Clifford attended on our behalf and is now sharing her knowledge with the staff.

Carol Ann had the privilege of hearing Rosie Batty open the conference and was shocked by the sobering statistics that Ms Batty discussed: at the current time, 2 women each week in Australia are killed in a domestic violence incident and 1 in 3 people (adults and children) are affected by domestic violence. These statistics apply to all and are not dependent on suburb, postcode or profession. Ms Batty encouraged the audience to begin teaching even very young children about 'respectful relationships' and reminded the audience that school forms part of "the training ground for life" and of the powerful influence they could have on shaping the next generation's attitudes and behaviours.

Dr Clifford has explained to our staff how gratitude is one of the most robust predictors of future wellbeing at the moment. Dr Jeffrey Froh is the most respected researcher in this area and his studies have shown that gratitude is linked to life satisfaction and school engagement. He has found that as gratitude goes up, materialism goes down and as gratitude goes down, mental health issues go up.

A final take home message from the conference was the idea that if you wanted to positively influence your children's current and future wellbeing, you should "spend twice as much time with them and half as much money". Definitely food for thought and we will be discussing how we can continue to improve wellbeing in our school by incorporating these themes into our learning.

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom.

The Camps, Sports & Excursion Fund (CSEF) will ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities.

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors; excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.





CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance will be paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per primary school student is \$125.00.

When will the results of the Konnective survey be available?	The results of the survey were sent home at the beginning of May and can be accessed from our homepage under "News & Events". All notices sent home are loaded to our 'General Notices' page (link on homepage) because we understand that not all notices make it home!

QUESTION/FEEDBACK	ANSWER/ACTION
Occasionally my child mentions that someone other than their usual teachers and assistant/s works in their classroom – who would this be?	From time-to-time teachers have a Student Teacher working with them and some students receive the support of an external allied healthcare professional e.g. Occupational Therapist. There may also be volunteers who read with the children.
I used to receive the Parents' Club minutes but now I don't.	Processes have been put into place to ensure that ALL registered Parents' Club members (not just Committee members) are once again receiving minutes.

SchoolMate

The Department with the help of Victoria's teaching associations has created an App for parents to help them become more involved in their children's education. SchoolMate is available for free download in the App Store or Google Play now. The App;

- *Shows parents what their children are learning in each subject at each year level according to the Victoria curriculum (AusVELS)
- *Provides parents with tips regarding what they can do at home to help their kids in the best way possible.
- *Suggests apps, books, events and activities related to each subject area and year level.



Our school, like all other government schools in Victoria, uses AusVELS as the basis for the learning programs we run at school every day.

Our teachers adapt the curriculum to meet the needs of our students and community, for example, designing learning programs around what your children are interested in, or around days or celebrations that are important to our community.

SchoolMate is designed to give you an overview of what children are expected to learn in Victorian government schools across every subject from Foundation to Year 10.
