Commitment

Learning to fly a radio controlled aircraft safely involves considerable commitment from the student and instructor. The process can take from a few weeks to several seasons and not all students will attain the proficiency required for graduation. Practice, as in most things, is essential, but there is no guarantee that a student will be successful in obtaining their Wings.

Participation in the Wings program requires that you maintain your aircraft in a flightworthy condition. This will require money for accessories, supplies and repair materials.

You must learn and observe the BRCM and MAAC safety rules and procedures. Model aircraft are not toys and can be dangerous if operated unsafely. Failure to obey rules will not be tolerated. **Download and read the Wings Program Guide.**

As a BRCM member you will have an obligation to assist in club activities. The club is run by volunteers, and this includes your Instructor.
