• Centura Contract Details

- o The management agreement provides MPMC with improved access to clinical and operational services, education and resources through Centura Health.
- o Through the management agreement, the Kremmling Memorial Hospital District Board of Directors will approve our chief executive officer, who will be employed through Centura Health.
- The Kremmling Memorial Hospital District Board of Directors will retain its governance and authority over MPMC. Under this management agreement, the chief executive officer will run the hospital operations on a day to day basis after June 1 and work with MPMC on an ongoing basis to identify areas where additional clinical and operational services, education and resources are needed.

- MPMC staff will have significant support and access to colleagues and partners throughout Centura Health
 with whom they can discuss challenges, explore best practices and obtain feedback to help determine high
 value health care solutions for our communities.
- o In the future Centura may possibly start helping with billing services in the future but there is no plan in place at this time.

MPMC Employees

- o Centura has no authority to hire or fire Employees
- o There was public concern for the number of hours worked by employees and Doctors

Bob Wallace Comments about Centura and MPMC

- Centura spoke about how they are extremely proud to be connected with our community

- Centura has the capability to support small communities with the new health care laws
