

# 2014 Covered Bridge Excursion ~ October 14

Another indication is that Eileen is planning another adventure into the countryside to view beloved covered bridges and to take in some of the fall foliage while traveling the highways and byways of our beautiful state of Pennsylvania. This year's trip will take place on Tuesday, October 14, tentatively leaving the church parking lot at 7:30 a.m.

During the drive through the countryside, you can look forward to seeing rolling farm lands, all kinds of animals, and probably a few Amish folks here and there.
