On the morning of Thursday, March 11, MLC students came to first-hour senior religion classes to prepare the seniors for canvassing. The goal was to hand out fliers for Evergreen and Holy Trinity. After chapel, the seniors were split into groups and bussed out to nearby neighborhoods to hand out the fliers. They canvassed for two hours then returned to school. On Friday, the junior class did the same thing in different neighborhoods. Overall, 2000 fliers were handed out to the community, a big help in spreading the news about the school and church. The MLC students said that even if 1% of the people who received the fliers decide to check out Evergreen and Holy Trinity, that is still 20 people, a great number.

Brief look at St. Patrick's Day







On Saturday, March 6th, the team attended the Washington regional tournament at Bellevue High School. There were about 40 schools ranging from 2-B to 4-A in size. The team had the opportunity to choose their own name, and agreed on "the Tater-tots". The team members first competed in an oral round in which we worked together to answer 35 multiple-choice questions. After that, they had a snack in the cafeteria and talked amongst themselves. They then competed in three rounds of 45 questions. The team did not get first place but had, all-in- all, a good day.


