#### **SCHOOL PROJECT**

#### Purpose:

Students will work as a team to achieve a common goal. Students will develop an understanding of the process of planning and implementing and completing a goal. Students will become aware of the rewards obtained from helping others.

#### **Description:**

The School Project must be a service to your particular school. Under the coordinators' supervision RVI students must complete the project. One student will present the project at the State Leadership Conference. The project must benefit the entire school and relate to only one central theme. The project must have been a service to the school during the current school year.

#### **Examples:**

Project ideas include, but are not limited to, the following areas:

School Beautification Project Career Nights Teacher Appreciation Bulletin Boards School Directories

### **Rules and Procedures:**

- 1. The school project must be a service to the school in which the students who are competing are presently enrolled.
- 2. The students will plan and administer the project under the direction of the RVI Coordinator.
- 3. The project will be bound in a 3-ring notebook with not more than 15 pages (one side only) including pictures and written explanation. The rating sheet, title page, and verification sheet do not count as the 15 pages. When using sheet protectors, one sheet per cover allowed. There shall be absolutely nothing on the backside of any of the 15 pages.
- 4. The written explanation will be done by the student(s).
- 5. One student must be available to answer questions for the judges at the State Leadership Conference.
- 6. The principal or vocational supervisor must verify that the project was done and that it was the work of the students on the Verification Form (Appendix D). If the sheet is not included, 25 points will be deducted.
- 7. The purpose of the school project will be stated on the first page, which follows the title page.
- 8. The project will be a learning experience for the students.

9. The project will be technically relevant and documentation should show how technical skills were used in this project.

## **Suggest Questions for the Judges:**

- 1. How many students were involved?
- 2. How did you decide on this project?
- 3. Did you work on the project during school, after school, etc.?
- 4. Where did you get the money to fund this event?
