JASON'S JOURNAL – The Principal's Message

As we continue to meet the needs of the children in our care we also begin our planning for 2016. I again ask that if you have matters that are of interest to the educational wellbeing of your child, please submit a request via the template on the school website homepage before the end of the month. (Furthermore, we require written notification of child/ren who will not be at BLPS in 2016 to blackburn.lake.ps@edumail.vic.gov.au).

Blackburn Lake Primary School is a traditional school with universal ethics and high standards. Whilst acknowledging that children learn in "stages not ages," the organisation of our school is ideally around straight grades (using the AusVELS terminology of "levels") with multi-age classes placed where needed as our aim is to create the best balanced groupings. With our school reputation continuing to grow we are planning for additional classes in 2016, with expected AusVELS (curriculum) teaching teams and class structure for 2016:

- Prep: three or four "straight" Foundation classes (depending on final enrolments)
- 1/2: three Level 1s / three Level 2 classes
- 3/4: three Level 3 classes / three Level 4s
- 5/6: two "straight" Level 5s / one 5/6 multi-age class / three straight Level 6s

Before the end of the year, I expect to be in a position to indicate to all parents and our wider community the allocation of staff to each of these roles for 2016. Please be aware that at this time of the year, our teaching and non-teaching staff have the opportunity to apply for other positions state wide and often it is very late in proceedings when we are able to confirm final arrangements. Importantly, towards the end of term 4 all students participate in a comprehensive orientation and transition program through which they meet their 2016 teacher and new classmates in preparation for the new year.

PARENT OPINION SURVEY

No 33

The three important groups in our school community – staff, parents, students - are surveyed each year, with their data sources used annually as we track our Strategic Plan progress. (Level 5/6) Student Attitude To School Survey results were returned earlier this year, with both the Parent Opinion Survey and the Staff Opinion Survey presented and discussed at this week's School Council meeting. I have also shared the results and congratulated staff, whose dedication often puts other people's families/children ahead of their own, with most Parent Opinion Survey variables progressing from below state means to above (one example being General Satisfaction a 6.10 on a seven point scale).

With 48 parents responding from the 100 Parent Opinion surveys sent, some written comments praised:

- (Teacher's name) has been amazing and goes above and beyond what is expected (child's name) has loved every aspect of BLPS.
- Very happy with the teachers/staff/curriculum and extra-curricular activities offered by BLPS.
- This school communicates well with parents and the strongest part is the dedication and care that is provided by the teachers.

As well as energy and expertise in crafting opportunities for success, our teachers' start with the foundation of relationships:

- The school provides an excellent standard of education and constantly strives to improve. The social program, including buddies, discussions about school values and BounceBack are a real strength of the school.
- The school demonstrates strong values and sense of community. The good behaviour of the children reflects this.
- I continue to be impressed with all aspects of BLPS. As a parent I feel welcomed by staff, and my input is valued. My child continues to learn in all curriculum areas and feels a strong bond to BLPS.

With some survey comments providing suggestions for future planning:

- My kids enjoy school which is positive. The teachers are professional and caring. School has far too many extra-curricular activities which impedes on learning.
- Academically and socially, BLPS is an excellent school. However, its extra-curricular activities and facilities remain of a low standard. We would love to see investment in the school's oval and outside areas
- The school has increased its focus on academic areas in recent years. I would like to see this strengthened, with more being done for kids who are ahead of their peers.

Most importantly, rather than making assumptions or allowing problems to go underground:

- We came to BLPS two years ago and we really love it. The kids are both happy and settled. We had a problem a while back and it was handled very well.
- I am extremely happy with the school. If I have had any issues the Principal, Assistant Principal or my child's teachers have been extremely helpful.

I thank the randomly selected parents for the feedback, with the last comments reinforcing the need for parents to convey concerns when they arise, with your child's teacher your first port of call. Our teachers are available and can be found in their classroom between 8:50 – 9:00am each morning before commencing instruction, and we also appreciate that you use your child's diary or email (published in termly *Parent Planners*) as a form of quick communication with us.

The importance of quality teachers is no secret. Blackburn Lake Primary has sought out the best teachers as we know that student success depends on it. One parent comment captured the scope of an effective teacher who not only makes students feel good about school, but also about themselves and learning: "Every year at BLPS we have been impressed by the quality of teachers our children have had. Our children love school; they enjoy learning and love the friends they have made. They have all liked all the teachers they have had".

EDUCATION STATE

Last week I wrote about current education reforms and have had a number of questions about the two important initiatives being introduced: the Victorian Curriculum (to begin next year), and the Government's commitment to establishing Victoria as the Education State.



The distribution of "Gonski" funding has been determined (with school allocations available at http://www.education.vic.gov.au/about/educationstate/Pages/schoolbudget.aspx) with BLPS to receive the minimum \$5,000 "equity funding;" \$566 million distributed to schools based on social disadvantage (determined by the school's SFO) and also 11,500 secondary school students receiving a \$2,000 "catch up" loading (determined by Level 5 NAPLAN results). Ultimately it is great to see better funding in Victoria, with Expenditure on school education (from July's Summary Statistics for Victorian Schools at http://www.education.vic.gov.au/about/department/Pages/factsandfigures.aspx) showing national funding.

Our school community is fortunate to have parents who strongly value and support education and opportunity for their children. The government has developed new targets to measure the success of the school system as a whole; including the fundamentals of literacy, numeracy and scientific literacy, but extending well beyond them to also cover excellence in the arts, critical and creative thinking, physical activity and resilience, as well as our progress in breaking the link between disadvantage and achievement, and retaining more students in education.

Whilst many of the strategies suggested are already in place at BLPS, before the end of this year our Leadership Team will develop a draft Annual Implementation Plan that will include any new school improvement priorities and initiatives to be implemented in light of the exciting Education State initiative.

In a week where all staff are formally sharing their progress and successes of their Performance and Development Plans it is appropriate to acknowledge the high professionalism of the staff at Blackburn Lake PS, the rigorous programs they deliver, and the terrific student outcomes they continue to achieve. I thank the staff for going above and beyond – and also thank the parents who acknowledged these efforts through the Parent Opinion Survey positivity.

I hope to see you all at tomorrow's assembly @ 3pm to acknowledge our 'Students of the Week' and hear reports from students detailing this week's Prep and 1/2 incursions.

The grade 3 and 4 students have been studying the art of Rowena Martinich. She is an Abstract Expressionist painter who famously painted the Dandenong Station.

"Viachroma" is a 17m long, double-sided painting installation on the pedestrian overpass of Dandenong Station. Launched in December 2009, this work was funded by the Victorian Government Department of Transport and Connex. More than 8,000 commuters pass through this artwork each day.


Music: Count Us In

Might have the next Cadel Evans in our midst!!


REGIONAL ATHLETICS


JUMP ROPE FOR HEART

Make A Gelatin Disc

Best known for making jelly, gelatin is a fascinating substance that is used as a gelling agent not just in food, but in many other things. Here's how to make your very own gelatine product that can be used in further experiments or in some very cool artwork.

You'll need

- Small round mould (the underside of a jar lid works well)
- 3 x teaspoons of gelatin
- Cup or glass
- Spoon or icy pole stick
- Food dve
- 40mls of hot water

Instructions:

- 1. Squeeze a drop or two of coloured food dye into the hot water and mix with a spoon or icy pole stick.
- 2. Place 3 teaspoons of gelatin in a cup or glass.
- 3. Pour the coloured hot water into the cup with gelatin and mix gently with the icy pole stick or spoon.
- 4. Before the gelatin-water mix cools down and starts to set, you need to pour the mixture into your mould. Pour a thin layer into the mould, trying to avoid bubbles and mess.
- 5. Leave it to set. It will take a fairly short time for the gelatin to set like jelly (as soon as the mixture is cool), but will take 3 to 5 days to dry out completely and become a hard gelatine disc.
- 6. Once it is hard and dry, remove the gelatin disc from the mould.

You can continue to experiment with your gelatin disc. Try making 4 or so discs and placing them in various locations for a couple of weeks (freezer, bathroom or other humid environment, bury underground, hot dry spot). Or you may like to use your discs in some very cool art work mobiles, or as coloured film in some homemade binoculars/glasses.

What's happening?

Gelatin is a colourless, flavourless solid substance derived from the collagen inside animals' skin and bones. Commonly used as a gelling agent in food, it also has lots of other uses.

Gelatin is found in nearly all photographic films and papers, it makes up the shells of pharmaceutical capsules to make them easier to swallow, and believe it or not, even synchronized swimmers use gelatin to hold their hair in place during their routines because it will not dissolve in cold water.

The gelatin discs in this experiment should grow mould on them when placed for any length of time in a humid environment like a bathroom. They grow mould because gelatin is biodegradable and will rot away in soil becoming food for plants and mini beasts. The biodegradable properties of gelatin are useful to explore during a sustainability and environmental unit.

The mangoes are sold by the tray with each tray weighing about 7kg. The number of mangoes in a tray ranges from 14 to 20 mangoes, depending on the size of the mango.

Cost The cost per tray is \$25.00. Only full trays can be ordered.

Delivery date

Mangoes should be ready for collection from the school around the end of November or start of December. This date may vary slightly dependent upon ripening of the mangoes - confirmation will be made closer to the time. A list of mango recipes and handy hints will be provided with all orders.
