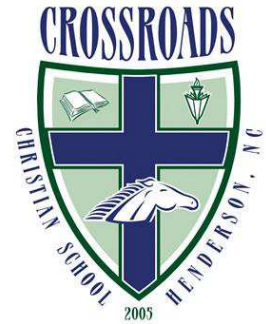


# CROSSROADS NEWSLETTER

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## Re-Enrollment Begins Monday, January 30

A two-week re-enrollment period for the 2012–2013 school year will begin on Monday, January 30, and run through Friday, February 10. Families who re-enroll during this time will receive a \$50 discount per child on the registration fee. All families who re-enroll during this time will be entered into a drawing for one of three prizes: a free book and activity fee, \$100 certificate to the school apparel store, or a \$50 certificate to the school apparel store. Open enrollment for new families will begin on Monday, February 13, and at that time, no place can be guaranteed.

## CCS Helps Fight Hunger



Members of CCS Student Council and Jr. Beta Club joined forces with over 75 local schools to host a mass food drive for “Students Against Hunger.” This campaign supports before and after school programs, Kids Cafes, and essential backpack programs in central and eastern North Carolina. CCS students collected over 1,000 items that will go to children in our local communities who may have otherwise not had enough to eat during this Christmas season. In total, 772 pounds of food was collected, and that food will provide over 650 meals!

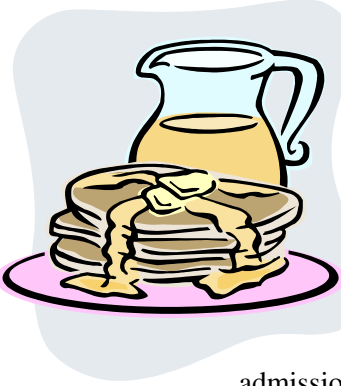

December holds deadlines for many **scholarships**. If you need assistance or recommendation letters from me or your teachers to meet a Dec. deadline, don’t put it off any longer! Christmas break you will be unable to reach your teachers, so get those recommendation requests in now!

**FAFSA Day** – Remember, you can begin filling out your FAFSA after January 1 if you plan on seeking any sort of financial aid from the college you’ll be attending. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid is your first step in getting that aid (which can include scholarships, grants, work-study opportunities, and loans). From the FAFSA, you will receive a SAR (Student Aid Report) which in turn is what the colleges use to negotiate a financial aid package for you. FAFSA Day is February 18, 2012—local community colleges and organizations have a time where you meet with a counselor and get help in completing the FAFSA successfully. ## Your Help Needed for Carpool Safety
