Students must nominate **two** teaching areas and list the relevant course codes they will study at USQ in their recommended enrolment pattern. Students are required to have at least **one** full teaching area that they are able to teach from Year 7-12 (major) and one other teaching area (major or minor).

Note: not all schools offer every subject. Students should check their local area for schools offering their teaching areas before committing to their program. Students will be required to complete professional experience in at least four different schools and may be required to travel or temporarily relocate to undertake professional experience.

7-9 university courses are required for a major teaching area in order to teach Years 7-12.

5-6 university courses are required for a minor teaching area in order to teach up to Year 10 (e.g. Junior Maths) or just in Years 11/12 (e.g. economics, legal studies). **Seven** courses are required for a second major teaching area.

Secondary: Students can either have **two** major teaching areas OR **one** extended major teaching area and **one** minor teaching area.

HPE secondary: HPE is your extended major; you can only have a minor (junior) area as your second teaching area.
