

It is officially spring now. Most everyone have been doing various spring cleaning chores. I can tell you from personal experience that this can be a pain. Don't forget to spruce-up and organize in your sewing room. Here are some easy hints for making the job manageable.

- 1 Organize and go through the mass. Weed out items needed to be *done soon*, *UFOs*, *not sures*, *garbage*, and *donate* items.

Haight, a former LQG member, graduated from the University of Nebraska in 1924 with a degree in agricultural engineering and farmed the land his grandparents homesteaded in Butler County. He made an estimated 300 quilts between 1935 and 1985. He approached quiltmaking like one of his favorite hobbies, creating and solving puzzles. His engineer's approach to problem solving and efficient processes resulted in precise and complex patterned quilts made in relatively short amounts of time.



Friendship Block Exchange/March/April 2011


6" Spool Block (Spool block will measure 61/2")

For EACH Block: Fabric A (the spool)

Cut one 2½" x 6½" strip of colored fabric Cut four 2½" squares of colored fabric

Fabric B (black background)

Cut two 2½" x 6½" strips of black fabric



Fold each square in half on the diagonal, with wrong sides together, and press to make a crease.

Place two squares at each end of both black strips, with right sides together. Stitch one thread outside the crease line. Trim the seam allances to $\frac{1}{4}$ "

Press one seam inward and one seam outward.

Join the three strips using ¼" seams. Press these seams to the inside. (Follow arrows for pressing).




