#### A Reminder about School Uniform

<u>School uniform</u> – We have a smart and distinctive uniform which makes a positive contribution to the school's image. It is to be worn by all students and parents are asked to fully support the school on this policy.

Many parents will be purchasing new items of uniform during the summer break to replace those that have been outgrown or have worn out. Please ensure that these items of clothing conform to the school's dress code as described below.

<u>Tops</u> - Either the burgundy zip fronted top or the black microfleece with the school name on it is compulsory. It is expected that every student will wear one of these to and from school. Other types of sweatshirts and hoodies are not to be worn. If a student needs an extra layer of clothing then a burgundy Tee-shirt may be worn under the school polo shirt. No other colour Tee-shirt should be worn. Given the uncertainty of our Cornish climate it is recommended that students wear a suitable rainproof coat to and from school if there is a chance of cold or wet weather. This is also a very sensible and necessary item of clothing for any school visit.

<u>Shoes</u> – Students are expected to wear appropriate shoes that are completely black in colour. Shoes with logos and other colours are not acceptable. No high heels, steel toe caps, boots or fashion trainers are to be worn in school.

<u>Trousers/skirts/belts</u> – The only skirt to be worn is the approved RLS one.

Trousers should be black and of a traditional style, of the sort that will hold a crease in the leg. Fashion trousers with added details such as studs, logos or extralarge buttons, skinny or extra wide trousers, denim or cord trousers and those that look like jeans are not acceptable. Belts should be slim and black.

# ANOTHER OUTSTANDING YEAR FOR LANDER IN ATHLETICS

his summer has once again been a highly successful time for RLS on the Athletics track/field. Here is a list of some of the achievements of our students/teams.

 Track and Field Cup – County winners - Junior boys (Year 7&8), Inter Girls (Year 9&10), Inter Boys (Year 9&10) this team winning by over 100 points. Junior Girls finished 2<sup>nd</sup>, only beaten by Truro School.

So out of 4 County competitions we won 3 and finished 2<sup>nd</sup> in the other. This lead to 3 of our teams competing in Exeter in the regional B final which included many top state and private schools from the South of England. Our results were again amazing; winning the Inter Boys competition and coming second in the Inter Girls.

Year 7 and 8 County
 Champs. At this event over 20 schools from around Cornwall compete. Our Year 7 Boys team won and our other 3

teams, Year 7 Girls, Year 8 Boys and Year 8 Girls all finished runners up.

Cornwall School Games – In this competition, teams of 8 compete in 2 events each. We qualified for the Year 7 Boys and Year 7 Girls competition and also the Year 10/11 Boys and Year 10/11Girls competition. Once again our students were outstanding achieving 29 top 3 positions leading our teams to win all 4 competitions.

Individually we have had 3

'absolute' stars in Athletics who have achieved County selection and considerable success in these C o u n t y / r e g i o n a l competitions. Georgia Doyle-Lay, Cameron Sykes (Year 9) and Olly Clark (Year 11) have all represented the County and achieved numerous personal bests in a range of Athletic events. Both Georgia and Olly will be representing Cornwall Schools in Birmingham on 6th/7th July, an event which will be shown live on Sky Sports.









### 21 Records Smashed at Sports Day Report by Wint-Wah Naing

I t has come around to that time of year again when Richard Lander students compete against each other in track and field events during Sports Day. Our students are always eager to get involved in this every year and those that don't compete in the main events offer great support and take part in fun activities such as volley ball and tennis which are set up around the track. Sports Day was a real success with over 400 students representing their learning communities; Pentire, Godrevy, Rame and Towan; with a healthy competitive attitude. Overall Towan were victorious, ably lead by acting director, Mrs L. Charleston, who was the only female director on the field.

Throughout the day, an amazing 21 new records were set. Newcomer, Jacob Milligan, from year 7 broke not one but two records, amongst other double record breakers, such as Head Boy, Harry Searle and Cameron Sykes who smashed the

year 9 High Jump record and set the record for the new event of 300m. As students are only allowed to compete in one track and one field event this represents 100% record breaking success! A special mention has to go to our star athlete, Georgia Doyle-Lay, who unsurprisingly also broke 2 records. Georgia has recently learned that she is through to the National Athletics Combined Events Finals which will be held in September when everyone from Richard Lander will be cheering her on. ## RLS Students at the Teen Tech Final, The Royal Society

n the 24<sup>th</sup> of June five students from year 7 and 8 competed in the finals of a national science competition, The Teen Tech award, held at The Royal Society in London.

The students got to meet various celebrities including James May (from Top Gear), Brian Cox (various BBC documentaries), Liz Bonnin and Dallas Campbell (both from Bang Goes the Theory). The boys exhibited their idea of Waste Wax which would change

colour upon contact with raw sewage. Meanwhile, the girls exhibited their idea of an InsuPatch for diabetics that uses patches rather than needles to sample blood glucose levels and secrete insulin. They had to present their work to panels of judges and create display boards to showcase their ideas.

The students were absolutely fantastic: confident, charismatic and enthusiastic. Although they did not win, they thoroughly deserved to and had a fabulous time nevertheless. Other highlights of the trip included a trip on the London Eye and a trip to see

Charlie and The Chocolate Factory at The Theatre Royal. The students involved were Hector Faux, Ethan King and Michael Hammond (year 7) and, Grace Fawcitt and Emily Cheetham (year 8).

The following Thursday, the teams took their products to Big Bang Southwest, where the boys team won Best STEM project and £50 Amazon Voucher each and the girls team were placed in the top ten in the South West and have won themselves another trip to the final in London next March!

## French Speaking Workshop at Bath University

n Friday the 21<sup>st</sup> June a small number of year 7 students were offered the fabulous opportunity to spend the day at Bath University taking part in a French speaking workshop.

It was an early start but everyone involved agreed it was well worth it. Students were split into small groups, each working with a qualified teacher. They started the day playing games to learn new vocabulary related to the solar

system, they then progressed to using this vocabulary in full sentences and finally whole paragraphs. Eventually, our students produced presentations about the solar system in French. All staff involved were impressed by well students worked independently and how well they used their knowledge of French to put together excellent and imaginative presentations. The first group played the part of aliens from each planet in the solar system and described the planets they lived on. The second pretended to be aliens waiting at a space ship bus stop and discussed which planets they would like to go to and

why, the third featured Doctor Who and his assistant who kept landing on the wrong planets and meeting aliens along the way.

A wonderful day was had by all.

Ethan King, who attended the day, said "The trip to Bath was an amazing experience, and the tutors really helped me develop my French skills. Throughout the day we created a presentation to perform to our peers, the presentation was based around le système solaire, we learnt the names of the planets in French, the adjectives to describe the planets and much more. At the end of the day we performed our master pieces to everyone one that went. Overall it was a great day and an incredible day of learning."


