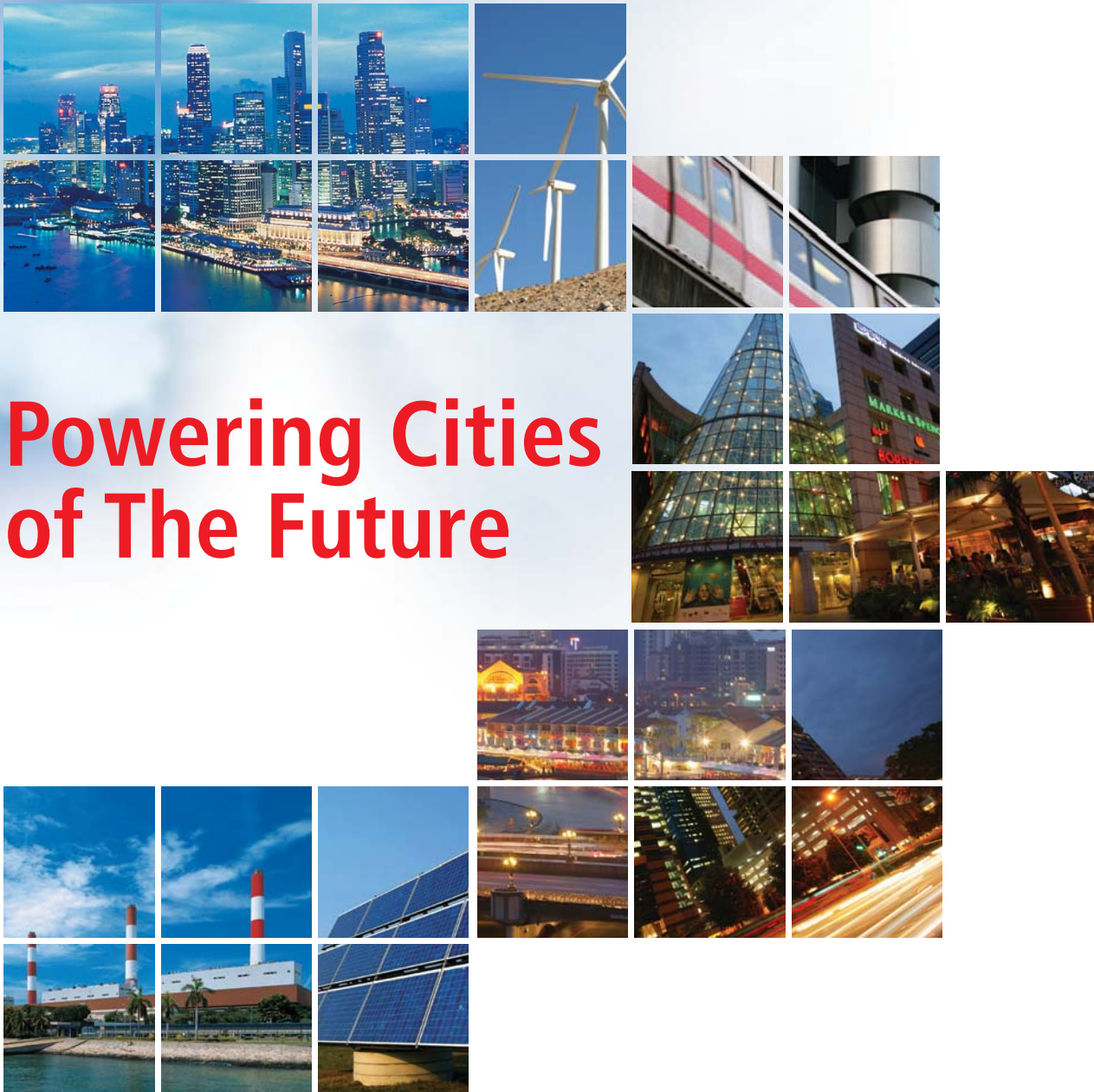

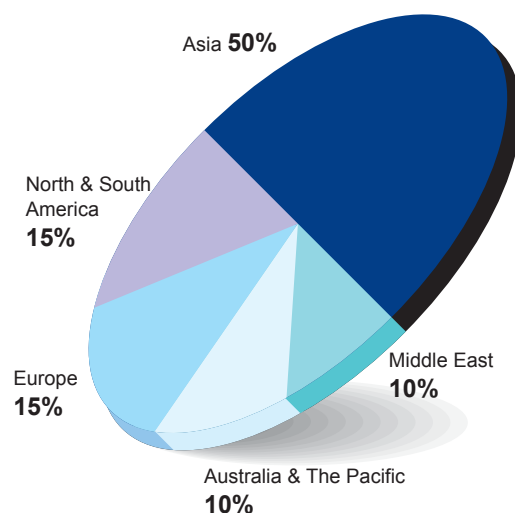
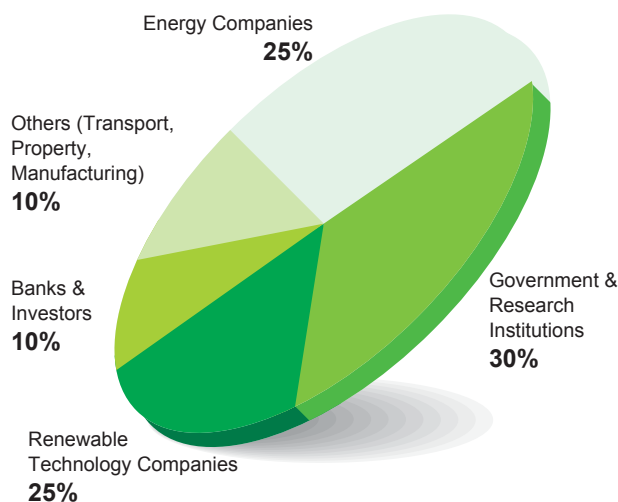

Mr Peter Schwartz is the Cofounder and Chairman of Global Business Network, a Monitor Group company, and a partner of the Monitor Group. His current research and scenario work encompasses energy resources and the environment, technology, telecommunications, media, entertainment, aerospace, and national security.



Mr Malcolm Wicks is the Minister of State for Energy at the Department for Business, Enterprise and Regulatory Reform (BERR) of the United Kingdom. He has served as Minister of State for Science and Innovation and Minister of State for Energy. His keen concern about fuel poverty led him to act as a Trustee of the National Energy Foundation. Mr Wicks has been a Member of Parliament for Croydon North since 1992.



Mr Duncan Macleod is the Vice President in charge of Shell Hydrogen. Mr Macleod has a Shell career spanning three decades working in Venezuela, the Caribbean, Nigeria, Japan and the Netherlands and has held key positions in supply/ trading, M&A, upstream, strategy, Government relations. Mr Macleod was also instrumental in setting-up Shell's biofuels technology ventures with logen in Canada and Choren in Germany.



Prof Hadi Dowlatabadi is the Canada Research Chair & Professor in Applied Mathematics and Global Change at the University of British Columbia. He received his PhD in Physics from University of Cambridge (1984). He has focused on public policy of resources and the environment. He is co-founder of Offsetters.ca, CTO of Green-Erg Technologies, and sits on the Board of the Canadian Bioenergy Corporation.



Dr Richard A. Bradley is the Head of the Energy Efficiency and Environment Division at the International Energy Agency in Paris. Dr Bradley was a senior negotiator for the U.S. on multilateral energy and environment agreements, including: the Framework Convention on Climate Change, the Kyoto Protocol, the NOx Protocol under the Long-Range Transboundary Air Pollution Convention, and the Montréal Protocol.



Mr Goh Chye Boon is Deputy Secretary (Special Projects) for the Ministry of Trade and Industry (MTI), overseeing the organization of the inaugural Formula One night race in Singapore. Mr Goh is the Chief Executive Officer of the Sino-Singapore Tianjin Eco-City (SSTEC) and sits on the board of the Economic Development Board of Singapore.



Mr Risto Rinne is the President of Neste Oil. He is Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Chemicals Industry Federation of Finland, member of the Board of Directors of EUROPIA (the European Petroleum Industry Association) and Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Finnish Oil and Gas Federation.



Mr Kenji Kobayashi is the Managing Director of the Institute of Energy Economics, Japan (IEEJ) as well as President of Asia Pacific Energy Research Centre (APEREC). Previously, Mr Kobayashi was Executive Director for International Affairs in Japan Oil, Gas and Metals National Corporation (JOGMEC). He has worked for the International Energy Agency and the Japanese Ministry of Trade, Economy and Industry.



Mr Justin R. Swift is the Deputy Assistant Secretary for International Affairs in the Office of Fossil Energy for the U.S. Department of Energy. He is responsible for export and import activities within the Office of Clean Coal and the Office of Oil and Natural Gas and Petroleum Technology.



Dr Jim Watson is Deputy Director of the Sussex Energy Group at Sussex University in the UK and Joint Deputy Leader of the Tyndall Centre Climate Change and Energy Programme. He conducts research on distributed energy systems, the economics of carbon capture and storage and nuclear power. Dr Watson is a Council Member of the British Institute for Energy Economics and a Specialist Adviser to the House of Commons Environment, Food and Rural Affairs Committee.



Dr Robert K. Dixon is the Senior Coordinator, National Security Council and Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) Task Force on Energy Security and Climate Change, Executive Office of the President, The White House. He has previously worked for the International Energy Agency Council on Environmental Quality, U.S. Department of Energy and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.



Mr Michael Dolan joined Mobil Oil Corporation in 1980 and is currently Senior Vice President of the Exxon Mobil Corporation. Mr Dolan has served as the Middle East and Africa Regional Director of ExxonMobil Chemical Company and Executive Vice President for ExxonMobil Saudi Arabia. Mr Dolan is a Director of the American Chemistry Council, the U.S.-Saudi Arabian Business Council and the Society of Chemical Industry.

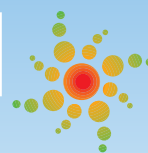
