Stage set for Blackpool 2015

This month's Annual Meeting will once again draw CIU members from all over the country to Blackpool, as the assembled delegates engage in debate as they help shape the future of the Union.

The National Executive Committee has tabled 10 notices of motion regarding changes to the Union's Constitution (the full agenda and list of motions is on page 15).

Blackpool 2015 encompasses several other events for Union members, not least the 24th Beer & Trades Exhibition which starts at 1pm on Friday, April 10, the day before the Annual Meeting.

The newly expanded show, to be staged in the Norbreck Castle Hotel's Norcalympia suite, will give Union members the chance to network with other clubs as well as with the Union's National Accounts and club suppliers.

The full list of exhibitors is: AON, Avensure, Blackpool AV, BOC, Booker Wholesale, CAMRA, Carlsberg UK, Chemisphere, Club Control, *Club Journal*, Co-op Bank, Dransfields, Dunlop Heywood, Heineken UK, Redtooth, Sky Sports and Smart Energy Projects.

There will be some famous faces on the Sky Sports stand with former professional darts players Wayne Mardle and Peter Manley inviting club members to come up on stage and throw three darts against them. Anyone who beats either of them will win themselves a bottle of champagne!

The weekend's activities will conclude with the Dransfields CIU National Quiz Final taking place at 1pm on Saturday, April 11, in the Norbreck Castle Hotel's Boston Suite.

"A huge amount of effort has been put into ensuring Union members have a really worthwhile experience at Blackpool 2015," said Union President George Dawson CMD.

"The Beer & Trades Exhibition, Annual Meeting and Dransfields CIU National Quiz are all part of a key weekend for the Union."

ALL MOD CONS FOR OLD WOKING

The recently refurbished Old Woking & District Recreational Club is one of the jewels in the crown of the South East Met Branch with superb facilities, a welcoming atmosphere and a family-friendly ethos

hen a club counts musical legend Paul 'The Modfather' Weller amongst its membership, you expect a certain level of sophistication and style about the place – and Old Woking & District Recreational Club certainly doesn't disappoint.

Walk through the front door into the Members' Bar and you're greeted with a very smart, contemporary – yet comfortable – design, the club having benefited from a full refurbishment carried out by Thames Contracts at the tail-end of 2013.

Club Secretary Johnnie Barker explains: "We used to have a full-length bowls green at the side of the club but decided to sell off a portion of that for housing in order to fund a refurb.

"It obviously took a lot of hard work on the part of the committee to get the planning permission and see the plan come to fruition, but it has been a real success with the members absolutely delighted with the facilities they can now enjoy.

"We've continued to keep the bar prices

down as low as possible – Foster's lager is £2.50 a pint, Guinness is £2.70 and a Jack Daniels & Coke is £2.10, to give a few examples."

A large screen TV for showing the latest live events on BT Sport and Sky Sports enjoys a prime position in the centre of the bar, while just off it is a separate games area featuring two pool tables and a dartboard.

"The refurbishment has been a real success with the members delighted with the great facilities we now enjoy"

"It's great to have this separate games area as the darts and pool teams are a flourishing part of the club," says Johnnie.

"Live sport is also a very important part of the mix, particularly the Barclays Premier League matches on a Sunday which always draw a good crowd." At the opposite end of the bar is another separate area containing a splendid full-size vintage snooker table.

Meanwhile, upstairs, is the equally impressive main Function Room – also transformed in 2013 – which can accommodate up to 150 guests and features its own fully stocked bar, disabled access via a lift, a dual level recessed ceiling with LED perimeter lighting plus a raised stage.

"It's a tremendous space for any sort of function – wedding reception, birthday party, etc – and the demand is high with private functions on here most Saturday nights," says Johnnie.

"We also hold plenty of our own events in here, including regular darts tournaments and its ideal for that because there's space for four boards at a time with overhead spot lighting above each one and a stage for handing out the trophy at the end."

At the moment the club has four bar staff, headed up by Bar Manager Nathan Buckley, but there are imminent plans to recruit two more staff to the roster to keep up with the

demands of both the Members' Bar and the Function Room.

Even with a portion of its land disposed of, the club remains blessed with plenty of outside space with a sizeable car park at the front of the premises plus the remaining portion of the former bowls green transformed into a garden which is particularly popular with families during the warmer months.

"We get a really good mix of ages in here and position ourselves as a really family-friendly club. Out of our 355 members, around 100 of of them are women so we have a good gender mix too.

"We're holding a Family Fun Day in May with a bouncy castle, live music and barbecue in the garden and that should be a great event."

Another memorable and significant occasion took place in December 2014 as the club held a celebration to mark the 100th birthday of one of their life members, Ernie 'Nippy' Munn.

The Mayor of Woking unveiled a plaque at the club to announce Ernie as the first Old Woking Rec member to reach the age of 100, while delegates from the Naval Association mingled with many of Ernie's friends and family to pay tribute to the former Royal Navy man who survived being sunk twice while serving as a submariner in the early stages of World War 2 and subsequently spent four years in a Japanese prisoner of war camp.

"It was a very special event for a very remarkable man who served his country with distinction," says Johnny.

Another notable recent event saw 25 members of the club raising funds for Macmillan Cancer Support by completing



the arduous challenge of completing a onemile charity walk. The twist is that they completed the challenge while wearing women's high heeled shoes.

"It got very competitive," says Johnny, who was one of the club members to rise to the challenge. "So much so that we all ended up not just wearing high heels but dressed in full drag as we walked the mile collecting money in buckets as we went.

"The ladies who organised the event even handed out a prize for the best costume. It was great fun and most importantly raised over £1,400 for Macmillan."

Despite the relatively recent refurbishment, the club's committee continues to look at ways of improving the club.

"We've recently installed a fob entry system and the members absolutely love it. They say it's now like going into their second living room with all their friends here," says Johnny.

"It took a bit of time to set up – club Vice-President Graham Taylor and I spent a few hours programming each individual fob for all 355 members – but having the fob system just gives you that extra level of security of knowing that only your members and their guests can enter.

"And subject to getting the finances in place, we also want to upgrade the kitchen facilities upstairs and add some children's play equipment to the garden."

And what about their celebrity member, the founder of The Jam and The Style Council? "Paul Weller is a local boy and one of his best mates is a member here so he was only too pleased to join," says Johnny.

"We're aiming to get a signed photo of him up on the wall soon as not every club is lucky enough to have a genuine legend as a fully fledged member.

"All in all, we have a good mix of ages at the club with plenty of young people coming through to enjoy the great facilities and low bar prices.

"We're very lucky to have a very dedicated and hard-working committee who have put the club in a great position."

He was also a member of Bradford City Council from 1982 to 1994, serving as the council's Leader from 1992 to 1994.

Mr Sutcliffe announced last year that he would be standing down at the next election after more than 20 years of service.


