Dear Parents and Residents,

We are in the final month of a highly productive school year, one that we all should take great pride in. Our School Report Card shows that we are a school district in good standing on all Grade 3-8 assessments in ELA, Mathematics, Science, as well as Regents exams and Graduation rates, making Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in all areas. Our primary students have demonstrated a high level of achievement on individual reading assessments which is directly related to the accomplishments that they have made with our FROGS reading incentive program. We have a total of 223 students K-6 and 17 teachers being recognized as FROGS members this school year. The school wide goal of reading and taking 12,000 tests was exceeded mid-year with students passing tests on 24,245 books! The previous record was set in 1999-2000 with 13,807 tests passed. As promised, the students that became FROGS members this year will get their chance to duct tape their principal, Mrs. Woods to the wall on June 17th. We have some very excited students! I thought all of the warm hugs and kind comments I receive throughout the day meant they liked their principal but it appears as though the sympathy card that I have played isn't going to get me out of it. The duct taping event has been a great and playful motivator for the students and will take place on June 17th, our last FROGS assembly.

The successes our students have had on state assessments, regents exams, standardized and individual assessments is a direct result of standards based instruction, opportunity to practice higher level skills in the classroom and on assessments. I continue to be overwhelmed with the network of support that our students receive from the community, their families, and the LCS staff. With this support our students are achieving very successfully in their academics, through the arts, and in athletics. I am frequently reminded of how special our students are when I get informed by a number of people at different venues of how impressed they were with their politeness and well-mannered behavior. This is a reflection of the strong school community that is raising them.

In addition to being heavy into the assessment season, we are also provided opportunities to celebrate the successes of the school year. The following dates outline our award season:

GUIDANCE OFFICE NEWS



Summer School 2011

Students needing to attend summer school will be notified by mail a few days after school ends. Regional summer school programs for grades 7-12 are available at Ogdensburg Free Academy and Canton High School. Summer school traditionally runs from early July through mid-August. Attendance is crucial for success in summer school. Parents are responsible for transporting their child(ren) to and from summer school, but there is no cost to the family for the classes. Further information is available for pick up in the Guidance Office. Registration is available by calling Lisbon Central School and speaking with Miss Love or Mrs. Putman in the Guidance Office.

August 2011 Regents Exams

August Regents exams will be offered on August 17 and 18 this year. Again, the tests are available at Ogdensburg Free Academy and Canton High School, but students must register in July to take an August exam. Students wishing to retake a Regents exam without enrolling in the summer school course will be charged \$25.00 per exam for the administration and scoring. Regents exam schedules are not yet available, but should be developed by the state by early summer.

Guidance Direct

We have a guidance software program at Lisbon Central which allows students to create an account and do college and occupational searches, scholarship searches, interest inventories, resume preparation, etc. The program is Guidance Direct. Any student is welcome to sign on using the information below. I encourage students to access the program in study hall from student computers and from home via the Internet, and some teachers may use the program with an entire class. Once a student creates an account, Mrs. Putman can see any saved searches or data they have completed so that we can use it with them on future plans. Students and parents are welcome to use Guidance Direct throughout the summer from any computer with Internet access.

The First Sip: Your Child's Exposure to Alcohol

Your role as a parent is important in determining how your children will handle the temptation to drink alcohol. So how do you send the right message? Alcohol can be harmful and, for minors, illegal, but not providing information yourself will likely result in your child learning about it from other kids—and maybe trying it in risky settings. Here are considerations that may help.

Be a good role model

Be aware of the messages you are sending to your children. Managing your stress through exercise or a hobby shows your child that you don't have to drink to relax. Choosing soda over beer at social gatherings teaches your child that you don't need to drink to have fun.



Build your child's self-esteem

Saying "no" is easier for children with a positive self-image and strong sense of self. Help your child develop these characteristics by emphasizing strengths, reinforcing healthy behaviors and loving him or her unconditionally. Empower your child with the opportunity to make decisions. Show your child respect and trust with more freedom and responsibility as he or she grows older.

Begin alcohol education early

Preschool through early elementary years is a good time to use "teachable moments" to talk about alcohol. At this age, children are interested in how to be healthy and how to avoid harmful substances.

At about age 9, begin discussions about risks of alcohol, how it affects the body and its dangers to growing bodies. Friends and "fitting in" become important at this age. Find time to talk casually about alcohol and friends and how to say "no."

Be there for your teen

Your teen needs and wants your involvement and guidance (though he or she may not act like they do). Take a firm stance on alcohol and set rules, but give your trust and the freedom to make choices. 
