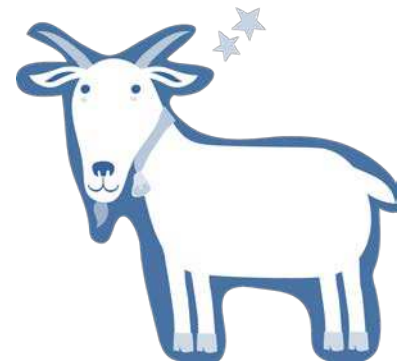
From the Superintendent

Beginning this fall, we, Jill Farrand and Brittney Stewart, will be teaching a new Grade 3/4 Multiage Program. We would like to invite you to attend an information session with us on Thursday, June 14th at 6:00 in room 107. During this session we will discuss what a Multiage Classroom is, the advantages of the program for students, the goals of the program, and how the classrooms will be organized.

In June, elementary classroom teachers will be recommending classroom placements for all students based on what they feel will be the best environment each child. These decisions are based on the student's academic skills and social/emotional needs. We would like to invite you to attend this meeting to hear the benefits of a Multiage Program so you can make an informed decision on whether you would like to have your child considered for placement in our multiage classroom.

What is a Multiage Program?

Multiage classrooms are balanced with a mixed group of abilities just as a traditional classroom is set up. The children remain in the program for a 2 year period. The instructional delivery model offers the opportunity for children to receive instruction at their ability level. The Multiage Program strives to develop children's independence as well as their interdependence.

Advantages:


- Time for children and parents to build a strong relationship with their teachers.
- Allows for seamless transitions which increases instructional time because students know the routines and teacher's expectations and the teachers know the learning styles of their students; where they are and where they need to go.

Final Grades & Regents Exam Grades

Please do not call the school to ask about Regents exam grades or final grades prior to report cards being mailed on June 25th for grades 7-12. We cannot give grades out until they are finalized, and new State scoring standards require that all Regents exams go through a computer scanning process to be scored. Thus, we expect to not have grades until report cards are completed. Teachers will also not be permitted to give students Regents exam scores because they are not considered official and definite until they have been scanned by the State. We appreciate your consideration in this request.

Summer School 2012

Students needing to attend summer school will be notified by mail a few days after school ends. Regional summer school for grades 7-12 is available at Ogdensburg Free Academy from July 5th through August 15th, with Regents Exams scheduled for August 16 & 17. Attendance is crucial for success in summer school. Parents are responsible for transporting their child(ren) to and from summer school, but there is no cost to the family for the classes. Further information is available for pick up in the Guidance Office. Registration is available by calling Lisbon Central School and speaking with Mrs. Barney or Mrs. Putman in the Guidance Office.

August 2012 Regents Exams

August Regents exams will be offered on August 16 and 17 this year. Again, the tests are available at Ogdensburg Free Academy and Canton High School, but students must register in July to take an August exam. Students wishing to retake a Regents exam without enrolling in the summer school course will be charged \$35.00 per exam for the administration and scoring. 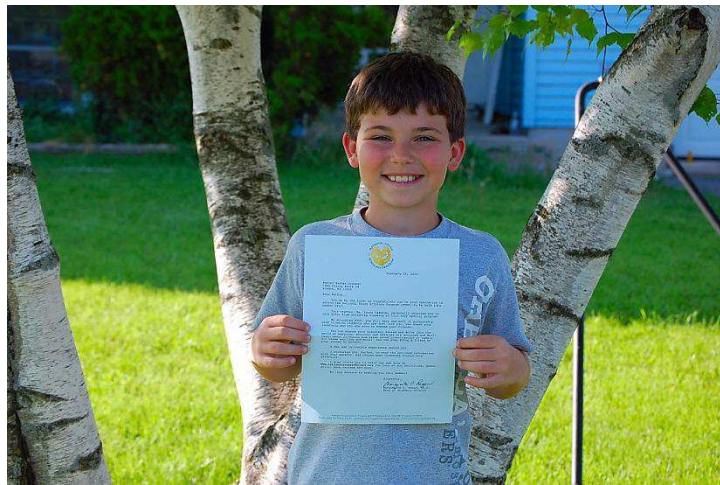

Lisbon Central School 4th grader, Nathan Spooner, will be taking part in the National Young Scholars Program this summer. Nathan was nominated by a teacher at Lisbon Central; his application was submitted in February and accepted.

This summer, high-achieving elementary school students will take part in the National Young Scholars Program (NYSP). Held on campuses across the United States, NYSP inspires outstanding 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students to explore, invent, learn and think creatively.

“The National Young Scholars Program provides students with the opportunity to engage in hands-on interactive learning, while challenging them in an intellectually stimulating environment outside of the regular classroom,” said Dr. Marguerite C. Regan, Dean of Academic Affairs for the Program.

NYSP gives students the chance to unleash their full learning potential as they further their interest in specific areas of study such as engineering, forensic science and medicine. Throughout the Program, young students engage in challenging coursework, gain a greater sense of independence and experience a renaissance of learning. The program culminates with student-created projects tying in leadership skills learned with the discoveries made in their specific area of study.

Activities such as embarking on a fascinating journey into the human body and solving a “whodunit” through work in a model forensics lab are just two highlights of the innovative curriculum. Stimulation activities and role-play encourage scholars to develop their leadership

skills, while introducing them to the concepts of team building, problem solving, public speaking and goal setting.

“NYSP taps into the natural curiosity that students at this young age already have,” said Dr. Regan. “This program will help them continue down a path toward a lifelong love of learning.”

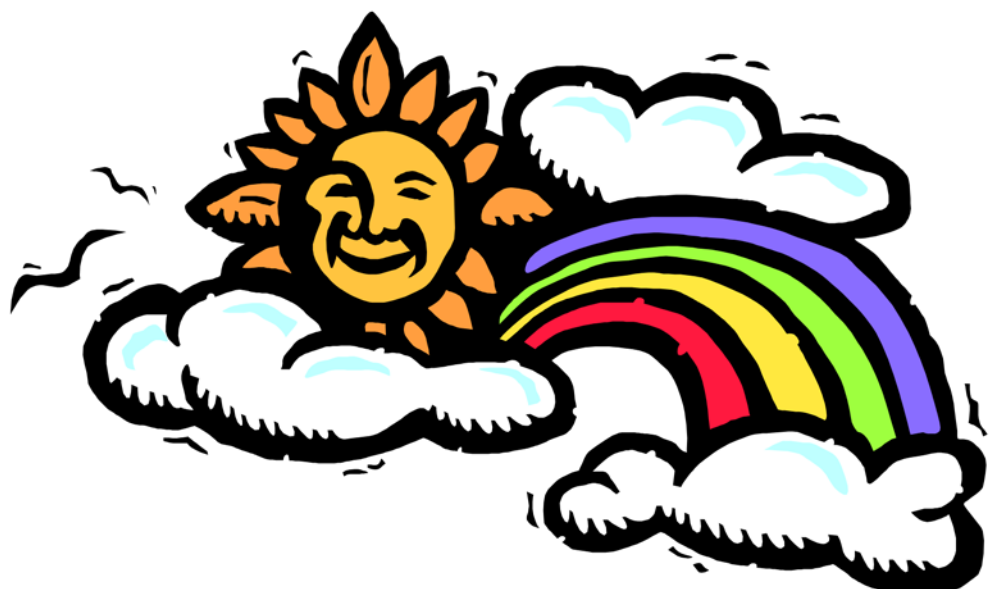
