FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Pursuing quality in the classroom remains a high priority for every student and their teachers. This year we are endeavouring to enable enhanced academic success even more by commencing the unit of work in each subject with the assessment item. This might mean showing students the assignment task sheet or providing sample questions that might be like the questions they receive on the exam. The purpose behind this is so that each student has a clear understanding of not only what they have to produce for the assessment item, but also what content they need to know, how they communicate this, and in what mode it has to be presented. This last point is important to note in that students who are asked to present a laboratory report for example in Science, are taught how to do a laboratory report. Similarly, if they are asked to justify, explain, describe or whatever action they have to do in that assessment, they know what this means and how to do it. Finally, the criteria by which students will be assessed have to be made very clear to students. The best way to do this is by showing students an example of the assignment.

In conclusion it is important for every child to know what they are learning, know how they will be assessed and understand how their work will be assessed in relation to the criteria. As we build our collective understanding of academic processes in schools, we will together build upon and further enhance the academic rigour at Mansfield High School. The desired outcome is, of course, better academic results.

PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Please do not set down, collect or park in any of the restricted zones near the entrances of the school, particularly the Broadwater Road Entrance near the Administration Building and the Ham Road Entrance near the Music Block. Please note that outside the Administration Building is a 'NO STANDING' zone that is frequently patrolled by the police or Council officers and the fines are heavy. Wherever there is a YELLOW LINE, vehicles are not to stop. Please DO NOT DRIVE INTO THE SCHOOL GROUNDS OR SCHOOL DRIVEWAYS at any time, including the Ham Road entrance to the Music Centre, other than to collect a sick student from the Administration Block or for evening functions. There are many safe areas along Broadwater Road west of Ham Road for drop-off and pick-up. It would be appreciated if you would arrange to collect your student from a designated meeting place some one hundred metres away from the school. Thank you for trying to make our school environment safer. It is so important!

 - 2. after presentation of all necessary documentation and
 - 3. after attendance at a scheduled Parent Conference with the Principal.
- B. Students outside the catchment area:
 - 1. after attendance at an Open Day and
 - 2. after an application package with the accompanying application fee is submitted and
 - 3. after an interview with the Principal.

MESSAGES

Parents/Guardians are requested to phone the school with a message for a student in an **emergency** situation only. This will ensure the efficient running of our school of over 1500 students. Day to day matters such as where to collect students need to be discussed prior to students arriving at the school in the morning. Parents bringing items left at home to school for students such as lunches, forms or sports items, must be a rare occurrence. Messages for students may only be passed on from parents or quardians.

COMMUNITY NEWS...Have your say – Queensland Education Trust community forum

Parents and carers are invited to have their say on how the next generation of Queenslanders can benefit from the state's resources boom. The State Government has launched a proposal paper, *From Mines to Minds: A Queensland Education Trust*, to establish a multi-billion dollar Queensland Education Trust using 50 per cent of royalties from Liquefied Natural Gas projects to provide more education and training opportunities for our children and young people. Ideas being considered include:

- Establishing Individual Trust Accounts for Education every child born on or after 1 July 2012 would have a nest egg valued between \$7800 and \$9500 when they turn 18; or
- Establishing a Dedicated Education Fund an investment fund where the proceeds would be reinvested by government in education and training initiatives beyond the basics throughout the schooling years and potentially beyond.
