


Thoughts and Notes From the Editor

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

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Lake Superior and Canada part two

Accumulate a total of 5000 kilometers of riding -all within a four-year period. In May, Glen finished the 1000K (621.37 miles) portion of the requirement and the last he needed for the award of the medal! The 5000K medal was established in 1961 and to date only 1102 medals have been earned - world wide. The list of riders earning the medal is shorter since some riders have earned it more than once. There are currently only 42 Americans with the medal (only 8 who have more than one). Glen joins two other KC cyclists as the only recipients in the Kansas City Area.. Congratulations on this great honor Glen and we are all very proud of you! Glen, Barbara and their 17 year old grandson, Patrick just finished the bike ride across Kansas. This is a 500 mile trip and there were about 875 riders.
