A-level:

- 65% A*-B, 99% A*-E
- 20 students achieved 3 A*/As



8 Oxbridge places secured & 5 for Medicine

AS-level:

- 42% A-B, 87% A-E
- 36 students achieved at least 2 A grades
- ALPS Grade 2 (top 10% of Sixth Form providers)

- October half-term: all UCAS applications complete
- By Christmas: all applications sent (to meet 15/1/16 UCAS deadline)
- 4th May: 2 choices confirmed
- 18th August: A-level Results Day

- Clearing + Adjustment 2016 (quota cap now lifted)
- (Re-) Apply in Sept. 2016 through school
- Y14 (with retakes) sometimes possible
- Careers guidance
- Apprenticeships



To boldly go beyond the specifications...

Making the difference at A2

- A2 requires even greater evidence of independent learning
- Final A2 units are about 'synopticity' (pulling all strands of the course/subject together)
- Using knowledge and understanding gained from wider reading is vital to show independence and synopticity
 - AO2 = synopticity (culture, gender, ethics, reductionists, free-will, determinism), commentary, strengths, limitations, counterarguments, opposing or supporting studies,
 - AO3 = methodological strengths, limitations and effects on the findings. Way research conducted. Is psychology a science?

Where to start?

 Students should get into the habit of reading a quality broadsheet newspaper, by using an app, website or buying a hard copy

Notifying us of Absence

- Phone student reception (or e-mail tutor)
- Notification of authorised absence (green form): signed by all teachers and passed to tutor
- Atypical requests to Head of Sixth Form
- Detailed attendance data recorded on SIMS



Study Periods

- Majority of students have 21 study periods every two weeks
- Sixth Form Library (open at 8am until 4pm/extended opening until 5pm on Mondays and Fridays)
- Collaborative working in Sixth Form cafe
- 'Free' Wi-Fi in Sixth Form Centre (for laptops/tablets)



Working at Home

- For every hour of lessons at least one hour of private study recommended (= 27 hours over two weeks)
- Using student planner to help organise workload and meet deadlines
- Logging onto FROG
- Importance of wider reading



Safeguarding in the Sixth Form

- Requirement to wear an identification badge and lanyard at all times whilst on the school site
- Signing in (morning + Period 5) and out
- Dressing appropriately for a school environment







Sanctions

- Text message home if tutor time or assembly missed
- Tutor to contact home if two consecutive activities missed
- Meeting with Head of Sixth Form (and placing on Monitoring report) if tutor time, assemblies, PSE continue to be missed (place in Sixth Form at risk)

Sanctions (cont.)

- Request for exam fees if lesson attendance below 95% (i.e. >5% unauthorised absence)
- Monitoring report by librarians (for study periods)
- Sent home to change if dressed inappropriately
- Sent home to fetch ID and lanyard (if persistently forgotten)
- Letter home if not scanning in/out




