Dear Parishioners,

What is the measure of true greatness? For some it is being recognized and celebrated. It is gaining a "title". For others it is power. For some it is the sense that they have made a mark in the world, accomplished something out of the ordinary, and won the admiration of others. We all can be influenced by such desires for greatness and recognition, even in subtle ways. In Jesus' world, the child is the one who has none of this. The child is not valued because he or she is not capable of doing something remarkable that will win the admiration of others. He or she cannot lead, amass power, exhibit prowess, establish their

authority, or make a significant contribution to the world. A child in Jesus' world has potential value, but in a world of a 50% infant and childhood mortality rate, they really don't count. (Remember the line from the Gospel about the number of people fed by the multiplication of loaves and fishes – five thousand, <u>not</u> <u>counting women and children.</u>) Jesus continues to teach us that true greatness is in emptying ourselves of power and becoming the servant. He himself demonstrated this when at the Last Supper he washed the feet of the twelve. In Jesus' world, the child is not necessarily regarded as innocent, precious, and priceless, but as the one without power, who can do nothing to enhance another's worth, and cannot offer another anything that can expand one's stature or sense of importance. Welcoming the one who can do nothing for us is receiving Jesus. The measure of true greatness is seeking only to show mercy and care for those who cannot repay, who seem in the eyes of the world not to count. Will we choose to be great in the eyes of our Lord, or continue to struggle for greatness measured by worldly success?

IT'S GREEK TO ME SCRIPTURE STUDY

The sessions focus on the readings for the upcoming weekend. **The readings for Sunday, September 27 are Mark 9:38-43,45,47-48 Numbers 11:25-29 and James 5:16.** Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

The gathering and presentation of the gifts at Mass is our ritual way of expressing the sacrificial love that we are called to live. When money, bread and wine are brought forward, we are presenting ourselves as a gift. Many churches, including St. Columba, have modified the monetary gift for convenience sake, and have introduced electronic giving. The unfortunate result has been separating the act of sacrificial giving from the Mass, the ritual heart of God's people. Given the way we use money today this may perhaps be necessary, but it doesn't change the fundamental action: we give ourselves and what is given back as a result of God's love is the living presence of Jesus. Sacrificial giving, the kind of selfless love Jesus modeled for us, means letting go of something of ourselves, not simply giving of what is left over. Our giving needs to impact our living; our living leads us to giving. Giving of oneself should be mindful and intentional, and an act of trust that God is faithful and that God provides what we need. It should be costly, or it doesn't represent the kind of giving that we are called to, and it isn't an act of faith. Typically we will give when there is a need. We need to keep the lights on, the water running, the ministries going. If people need food or clothing, we respond; if we need the parking lot repaired, people step up. And if services are continuing, and needs seem to be met, our giving seems to diminish. But this is not what sacrificial giving is about. We do not simply give to a need; we need to give. It is our very nature as followers of Christ to give because it is an act of faith and love.
