# 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time—July 26, 2015



Dear Parishioners,

The story of the Multiplication of the Loaves and Fishes occurs six times in the four gospels (Matthew and Mark have two stories each). It is one of those powerfully significant events that must have captured the imagination and the hearts of the early Christian community and became an important paradigm for their own Eucharistic celebrations and their understanding of what it means to be followers of Jesus. A large crowd, a shortage of resources, and the desire to be free of the responsibility of others, lead the disciples to want to avoid the potential problem. They seek to go around it, and Jesus wants them to go right into the mess, with a profound trust in the providence of God. The fear of scarcity of

resources often leads us to want to avoid the issues. How can we possibly be concerned about the serious social issues that face our world, or even the struggles of our neighbors? Such issues are too big for us, too complicated, and too deeply embedded in the very structure of things. And yet, the Christian has to be confident in what God can do with what little may be brought forward. Our resources might seem insignificant in the light of the scope of the problems, but in the act of entrusting them, putting them into the hands of Jesus, we believe that something great can happen. Did the boy with the five barley loaves and two fishes offer them to Jesus, or did the disciples discover him with his lunch, and coerce him to give it over? I like to think that a small person with small resources made an enormously important gesture and did not hold back, and because of one small act of generosity, a multitude was fed. I believe that such miracles happen today through the power of Christ. We are challenged to be generous and courageous enough to let go of what is precious to us and offer it to God. In that way, we too can feed a multitude. We continue to know him in the breaking of the bread.
