CWD Meeting

The Shell Lake CWD Citizen Advisory Team, is sponsoring a public informational meeting on Chronic Wasting Disease. The meeting will be at the Shell Lake High School on Tuesday, May 7 at 7:00 PM. The meeting will be held right after the Wolf Ridge spaghetti feed and fundraiser. This meeting will feature Dave Clausen, retired Wisconsin Natural Resources Board member. Mr. Clausen has been heavily involved with CWD since its discovery in southern Wisconsin in 2002. The meeting will feature a discussion on CWD as it relates to food safety and its history in southern Wisconsin. It will also feature an update on 2012 CWD monitoring efforts in northwest Wisconsin, and a discussion of potential monitoring plans for the 2013 deer seasons. The public is encouraged to provide their input for the Department and Citizen Advisory Committee to consider for the future management of this disease. By working together our hope is to provide a healthy and vigorous deer herd for future generations to enjoy.
