



State Officials Lease Waterways

The July 12, 2011 issue of The Times-Tribune, announced that thousands of acres PA owned land near rivers and lakes have been opened to Macellus Shale natural gas drilling. Water from the lakes will be sold to drilling companies. This water is used for hydraulic fracturing (also known as fracking). This allows the natural gas to escape from the shale by injecting chemical-laced water. In the past few years, more than 3,300 wells have been drilled across Pennsylvania. Although the industry claims this is a safe process, the Environmental Protection Agency has its doubts, as do many individuals who have been negatively impacted by the drilling. Approximately 14,000 acres of the commission's land and water holding as potential drilling sights.

Spotlight on: The Bob Snyder Family

The Snyder family has enjoyed Lake Winola since Bob's grandmother took his mother to the lake on family outings in the early twenties. Lake Winola was always his mother's favorite spot, and she was able to enjoy it until her passing last November at the age of 95. We estimate it to be over 90 years.

Starting in 1948, the Snyders rented one of Van Dorrick's cottages on Lake Street. In 1951 they purchased cottage number 769 from John Young. The cottage is located on what was then Dolph Street.

Bob's earliest memory of the lake was being "caught" by a fisherman after he fell in the lake in 1948. He was four years old, and glad the fisherman didn't practice catch and release. Life preservers on children around the lake were still far in the future.

Bob participated in many Regattas and Water Carnivals when he was young. He has some pictures as early as 1952 and a special "Billy Beer" trophy given to his mother for participation in one Water Carnival.



His two girls, Gail and Robin, spent all summers at the lake from their birth to the time they left for college. Now they visit, like Bob, as time permits. Gail has one son, Corwin, 10. they live in the historic town of Dickyville, Maryland. Robin has two children, Joesph, 5 and Emily, 3. They live in Allentown.

The whole Snyder family will visit the lake for Water Carnival. Despite their busy schedules, they have never missed a Water Carnival, proving their love for the event.

Bob is a past board member and president of the LWCA. He remembers the decision to apply for a grant to install sewers. Overfield Township would not approve spending the money to apply for a grant. At the time, it was an experimental sewage treatment plant. The board voted to fund the application (He believes it was \$300), and go ahead with the project. It was the last funding given by the federal government to pay for such a project. The directors and members who carried that forward are responsible for the lake we have today. Prior to sewers, it was a summer ritual for directors to walk the lake front to find overflowing septic tanks and cajole owners to make repairs.

Has everyone started their training for the 2nd Annual Dr. Thomas E. Zukoski Memorial 5K Run/Walk? This year's event will be on August 6th at 9am starting at the Lake Winola Firehouse. Last year we had an unbelievable turnout of over 250 runners and walkers enjoy the event, and we hope for another successful race this summer. All proceeds from this race will help fund a memorial scholarship at The Scranton Preparatory School established in the name of Dr. Thomas E. Zukoski. The race begins at the Lake Winola Firehouse, winds counpartially ter-clockwise around the lake, and takes you up and down through beautiful and scenic rural roads, where my father put hundreds of miles on his running sneakers over the years. 
LWCA Annual Dinner Dance at the Pavilion
