SOCIAL COMMITTEES

Back to School Social - Organize a social event (food/entertainment) at school for families to reconnect. (August) Bingo Night - Plan and help staff the annual PTA Family Bingo Night.

Family Social Night - Assist in the planning and running of one or more Family Social Nights at outside venues, such as Skate Night, Cougars Night, Wolves Night, or Players Night.

Fall Fest - Assist in planning and running a carnival type festival at the school. (September)

Metea Football Tailgate - Organize the food/activities at the Annual NYE Night at a Metea football game.

Movie Night - Plan and run the popular movie night in the NYE gym; select movie options and refreshments.

Room Parent – Assist in planning and running at least one of three annual room parties in your child's class. Work with other volunteers in your grade level and help with classroom Publishing Center projects as needed.

EDUCATIONAL ENRICHMENT COMMITTEES

Book Exchange - Oversee and/or volunteer at a used book exchange at Young.

Display Cases and Bulletin Boards - Coordinate and set up curriculum and school event specific displays in conjunction with Nancy Young staff and the PTA.

4th Grade State Fair – Assist staff members with the 4th Grade State Fair projects, room party, and evening program.

LMC Liaison / Book Fairs – Assist the LMC staff with special projects and book fairs. One Book/One School - Assist with planning and implementing activities for the multi-week One Book/One School

program, which promotes reading of a single book by the entire school. (January/February)

Publishing Center - Assist in running an in-house publishing center for books written by Young Elementary Students (both in-school interviewing/editing and at-home typing work available).

Legislative - Follow and report on important legislative efforts supported by the Illinois and National PTAs. Newsletter - Publish and/or distribute our monthly PTA newsletter, titled Newsplash.

PTA Membership – Assist in collecting PTA Membership forms, distributing PTA Membership cards, staffing

membership drives, and planning PTA sponsored parent education programs.

Social Media - Coordinate and monitor social media messages about school activities.

Volunteer Coordinator - Coordinate volunteers for various PTA events and committees.

Yearbook - Design and implement layout for the yearbook or assist with taking pictures throughout the year.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEES
