Tax Assistance Volunteers Have Busy Season

Every February through April for the past five years, local volunteers have given much of their time to help individuals prepare their income taxes, and every year, the volunteers have continued to increase the number of people they are helping. The volunteers are trained to provide the tax preparation services through AARP Tax Aide training. The tax preparation assistance is available to anyone with an annual gross income under \$58,000.

This tax season, volunteers prepared and e-filed 583 State Income taxes and 568 Federal Income taxes. Additionally, they filed fourteen paper returns and submitted seven amendments. The volunteers also fielded approximately 140 questions and answers.



Having this free service available in our community can make a world of difference to the individuals who qualify for the tax help. The tax preparation service helps low- to moderate-income taxpayers have more discretionary income for everyday essentials, such as food and housing, by assisting with tax services and ensuring they receive applicable tax credits and deductions.

Utilize United Way's 2-1-1 To Connect With Community Resources

Sometimes things happen to us in life unexpectedly, and sometimes, these unexpected surprises can bring joy and happiness into our lives. Unfortunately though, this certainly isn't always the case. It seems that more often than not, surprises can cause more harm than good, quickly adding to the stress and worry in our lives.

Events like these may include unexpected car trouble or medical bills that leave you struggling to make ends meet. Or, maybe an elderly parent falls ill and is no longer able to care for him or herself, leaving you to figure out how to care for your parent, while maintaining full-time employment. These are just a few examples of how one isolated incident can exacerbate our already busy, stressful lives. Don't face these problems on your own. There are services available to help people in many, various ways and United Way's 2-1-1 connects people to these resources.

United Way's 2-1-1 online information database is full of community resources available right at your fingertips. Simply log-on to www.getconnected.org and click on 'Information Database.' From there, you are able to search for resources by category, keyword, or agency. The database also allows you to enter your zip code to search for resources nearest to your home.

For those without internet access, 2-1-1 is also a phone number you can dial to get information on community resources. Referral specialists are available 24 hours a day, 7 days

a week to help with information and resources, such as: housing matters, food, child care services, counseling, literacy classes, health care, substance abuse treatment, family services, Veteran's services, suicide prevention, energy assistance, job training, senior services, volunteer opportunities, and much more.

the opportunity to give back to the community. "We have been so blessed to have a healthy family and for everything else we've been given in life, it is only right that we share with those going through a difficult time or less fortunate than we are," said Sharon.

During their time as Campaign Drive Chairs, the Helwigs hope to raise awareness about the issues residents in our community are facing; "Our community is not totally unlike others around the country—the economy has caused job loss or cuts in hours for some resulting in loss of benefits, like health insurance, leaving individuals and families scrambling to make ends meet. The instances of families living out of vehicles and knowing there are children and elderly people going to bed hungry—sometimes we think there are only hungry people in thirdworld countries when, in fact, it's happening to our own families, friends and neighbors right here in Marshfield and the surrounding area."

Dan and Sharon will also advocate to get

the community more involved; "If people aren't financially able to give, perhaps they could give an hour of their time occasionally (or on a regular basis) to give back to the community."

The Helwigs are looking forward to their time as Campaign Drive Chairs and highlighting Marshfield Area United Way's significant role in the community; "United Way gives hope to those who feel there is none for a brighter and better tomorrow. 

We are currently serving meals to a Marshfield couple who are both challenged with health concerns due to illness and falls. They are both 78 years old and living in their home of 50+ years. Meals were started for the husband when his wife was injured in a fall and ended up in the nursing home following surgery. The husband walks with a walker and manages very slowly. He was very dependent on his wife for meals and personal care. Recently, the wife was released from the nursing home, and now we are serving both of them. With meal assistance and

a personal care worker visiting regularly, they seem to be managing comfortably in their own home.

The mission of Home Delivered Meals is to improve the health and well-being of homebound individuals in the Marshfield community through the delivery of hot, nutritious meals.
