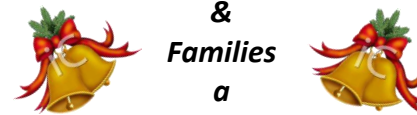

HISTORY OF FEINWERKBAU



The firm of Feinwerkbau Westinger & Altenburger GmbH was founded after the Second World War by engineers Karl Westinger and Ernst Altenburger, becoming a registered company in 1951. In the early years, up to 1960, the company's main source of income was the production of precision parts for other well-known companies. This period witnessed the development of the electro-mechanical calculator, at the time a very advanced product, and this was produced in large quantities by Olympia Werke in Wilhelmshaven. Right up to 1975, all Olympia calculators were developed in Oberndorf for serial production in Wilhelmshaven.

Following the establishment of the German Shooting Union in 1956, the founders of the company - both experienced gunmakers - developed the first competition air rifle, which featured a side-lever cocking mechanism, fixed barrel and patented recoilless action. This revolutionary product was a sensation in the early Sixties and won enthusiastic acclaim from all target shooters. Within a short period of time, almost all existing records had been shattered and targets were made smaller, but Feinwerkbau rifles still produced consistently world-beating results. This success was repeated in 1965 with the introduction of Feinwerkbau air pistols.


Thanks to these advances, Feinwerkbau was responsible for a dramatic improvement in the standards of high-precision shooting across the globe, and the enormous demand which was generated for Feinwerkbau target arms enabled the company to expand massively into the world of high-precision sporting arms. The ensuing years saw the production of spring-piston airguns, CO2 rifles and pistols, pre-compressed air-guns and most recently the development of compressed-air guns. The addition of a small-bore pistol, the AW93, and a complete range of small-bore target rifles complete the range of Feinwerkbau sporting guns.

To this day, Feinwerkbau still manufactures high precision parts and limited editions for other famous companies, thereby encouraging and maintaining the highest level of quality on the part of both management and staff.


The company employs some 140 people at present and is still managed by the sons of the founding partners.

PRESIDENTS REPORT

SRC REPORT



I Congratulate Karl Friehe who has through hard work and diligence has now become qualified as a Judge B for Service Pistol – this covers all the Service Pistol Matches including WA 1500.

I hear he is now working towards becoming qualified as a Judge B for Black Powder.

To achieve these levels Karl has had to pass several questions that have been sent to him over the past 18 months or so, then travel to Sydney to answer the final questions as well as passing a practical test. He could not do this in his home state as all aspiring Judge B Candidates have to be reviewed in another state or by an interstate Judge A.

The SRC has had a few busy weeks since the last magazine was published. I travelled to St Ives Pistol Club just out of Sydney to attend the 2014 Action Nationals as the Chairman of the Jury. The duration of these Nationals was 5 days. This was the first Club to hold an Action Pistol Competition in Australia and this was the 25th Anniversary of this event. I first was introduced to this Match shortly after and have continued to be involved with it ever since. Our WA Team went quite well in the team events.

While I was away, Port Bouvard held a WA 1500 Open with several Members of the SRC attending. November the 8th and 9th was a busy weekend as we had arranged a WA based level 1 ISSF RO Course for the Boyup Brook and Busselton Pistol Clubs.

We had 10 members from Busselton and 2 from Boyup Brook attend. Hardy and I were to attend originally, but I asked Brian Harvey if he could attend as well when the numbers suddenly grew. He kindly consented and rode his motorbike down. Hardy and I drove down early on Saturday so we could start at approx. 10am.

We had a very enthusiastic group from Busselton ranging in ages from a Great Grandmother to her great grandsons who weren't old enough to actually do the course but were very good participants. It was a pleasure to work with this group and even though no one passed on that weekend we were able to help them understand how to run a range safely and what to do when things do not go to plan.

The Busselton group are at a disadvantage as they do not have a live fire range as yet and rely on the good will of Boyup Brook sharing their range with them. This appears to be working well and they just require some more practice on running a range even if its only for half a match. Also, once they get more confidence, they may attend some of the next year's opens. Meantime we left Karl to run the Black Powder Open at Cockburn/Fremantle on the same Sunday.

November 14th to 16th I was in Melbourne finalising the format of the new Holster Course at a workshop with 4 others at Oakleigh Pistol Club. It is being tried out this weekend and if it is approved, will soon be available from me for Holster Trainers in WA.

November 22nd and 23rd was the last ISSF Open for the year. It was well attended as it was the last Competition for Competitors to shoot a good score to boost their average and get a place on the ISSF Team. As the results of this and the other Opens will be published in this magazine I will not include them in this report.

The last Open for the year will be the Port Bouvard Service Pistol Open. I will ask Karl to be the Judge for this event as this will be the first as an official Judge B for Service Pistol.

The SRC is planning at least 2 level 1 ISSF RO courses in the early new year, the first being at Whiteman Park – the Members have been very patient waiting for one, then possibly Kalgoorlie will be the next one.

Florence Mabel Southall

**26/02/1918 – 6/11/2014**

Mabel Southall's shooting career spanned 41 years, all of that time with the Geraldton Pistol Club.

Mabel commenced pistol shooting in 1969 after being introduced to the sport by her sister Hazel, who was a member of the Northampton Pistol Club. Mabel joined the Geraldton Pistol Club which at that stage was quite a new club, having only been formed in 1961 and only moving to its current location in 1969. She remembered the early days of the club and the limited shooting facilities and was involved in all of the major improvements to the club to this day.

Mabel held most positions in the club at some stage and was treasurer for many years, a position which I am sure all treasurers will agree, is sometimes not without challenge, her straightforward attitude meant that any issues were sorted quickly. Mabel was very capable and managed the clubs finances very well.

Mabel shot in competitions right up until her retirement from the sport in 2010 and at this point she was believed to have been the oldest competitive shooter in Australia. She was a trophy winner at both local and open competitions and the Masters games held in Broome in 2001 gave her two gold and four silver medals.

Many of the perpetual trophies in the clubhouse bear her name many times over.

Mabel attended the club to shoot twice a week and competed in all of the ISSF disciplines and also shot Black Powder for a while.

She rarely missed a shooting day and when on her travels, shot at other clubs around the country. Her easy to get along with attitude and keen sense of humour made her many friends in the sport.

In 2000, Mabel was awarded the Australian Sports Medal for her dedication and contribution to pistol shooting, an award she was proud of. Many shooters were introduced to the sport over the years by Mabel, myself included. Mabel would loan equipment to new shooters and offer advice or assistance wherever she could to both old and new alike. This earned her the highest degree of respect in the club.

Mabel was made a life member of the Geraldton Pistol Club for her contributions at a club level and by the time Mabel retired from competitive shooting in 2010 she held the record for the longest continuous membership of the Geraldton Pistol Club.

With the passing of Mabel, so another chapter in the history of the Geraldton Pistol Club closes. She will be sadly missed.
