



The Story – The Story presents the Bible in an abridged, chronological form and reveals the way the whole Bible fits together in a single grand narrative. We will meet each week for an in-depth look at the stories we have read the past week and learn more about God's grand story of salvation through Jesus Christ. This class begins on September 13 and will meet in the Fellowship Hall.

Basics of the Faith – This class will focus on the basics of our Christian faith as laid out in Luther's *Small Catechism*. It is primarily designed for those who are new to the Lutheran church and desire to become members, but it is a great refresher and overview of our Lutheran beliefs and is open to anyone who wants to attend. Pastor Borgstede will lead this study meeting in the Library beginning September 13.







Our church family is beginning a wonderful adventure! For 31 weeks, we will be traveling through God's story together. Our Sunday School children will be a part of this adventure. Children will enter into God's story in creative and meaningful ways as they explore God's Word in Sunday School. Family devotion materials and weekly parent pages will be provided for families to continue the adventure through God's Word together at home. Each week a different Bible story will come alive for all ages in our congregation. Children will receive a "trading card" of the Bible story each week.
