Emailed submissions must include a signed declaration form and can include three A3 pages of images, graphics or sketches to support your idea, to a limit of 5MB.

- Create a community for all ages, ethnicity and backgrounds.
- A diverse community is more vibrant
- Allows the sharing experiences and provides a diversity of interests that can complement each other.
- Promotes creativity and innovation into the precinct's cultural fabric
- As it provides for a healthy environment, social justice and economic stability

HOW?

- Cater for the young: introduce inexpensive housing such as ship containers that mark the site's maritime history. This could be also a temporary measure whilst the precinct develops.
- Promote multi-culturalism and diversity of backgrounds: Develop housing that provides for an array of different demands, from top end to more affordable. Include student accommodations to enrich the diversity. Cater for young families by introducing affordable housing.
- Provide for the elderly: develop communal houses that are tailored for this group, where the elderly age in their community, be actively engaged with society and experience life's variety and diversity.
- The concept where various individuals share a dwelling, in the case of new aged living, seniors share a house in which common areas are shared such as kitchen, living spaces, TV room and garden, whilst each individual has their own private sphere composed of a large bedroom, kitchenette and ensuite.

FACTS:

- today a lot more senior citizens have an active lifestyle
- 40% of all seniors in retirement do not need a nursing home
- family structures have changed in the last twenty five years
- there is a shortage of nursing homes, and hostels and demand will continue to increase
- there is currently a long waiting list for Government carer help in homes
- seniors in large nursing homes tend to be disengaged from society in general
