Parent - Teacher Conferences: Parent Teacher Conferences will be held on Wednesday, November 4th from 1:00 PM – 7:00 PM for Preschool Full day thru 8th grade. Fundraising Summary: The fundraising summary for the 1st nine week period is included in this packet. Please review the information on the fundraising financial report. Your continued support with our fundraising effort is greatly appreciated.

Weather Closing and Delays: If inclement weather or some other emergency requires that the school be delayed, closed, or dismissed early, you will receive a phone call from The School Reach Automated call system. This information will also be announced on the KDKA television station also. Remember to look for Holy Trinity School Robinson on the news station. Our Morning Care Program will be available on 2 hours delays for the cost of \$7.00 for 1 hour, \$8.00 for 2 hours and \$9.00 for 3 hours for any parents needing this service.

Dress Code Changes: Please make note of the changes in the uniform policy in the Parent Handbook. The changes are effective beginning November 1st. Navy shorts are no longer permitted to be worn. Only the school plaid uniforms and navy pants are permitted for the girls with blue knee socks. Boys are only permitted to wear navy pants and a polo or oxford shirt. The mass day uniform remains the same. Please remember we go outside if the temperature is above 32 degrees. Be sure that your child has on a coat suitable for winter weather.

I-Ready Diagnostic& Instruction: Students in $2^{nd} - 8^{th}$ grades will be participating in a program called i-Ready® Diagnostic & Instruction that will provide our students with an innovative diagnostic assessment and engaging instruction. The focus of this online program is reading and math. i-Ready Diagnostic & Instruction helps teachers to effectively assess their students and then provide individualized instruction based on each student's unique needs.

i-Ready Diagnostic & Instruction assesses and teaches the following skill areas: Reading, Math, Phonological Awareness, Number and Operations, Phonics, Algebra and Algebraic Thinking, High-Frequency Words, Measurement and Data, Vocabulary, Geometry, and Comprehension

i-Ready Diagnostic & Instruction begins by giving students an adaptive assessment in reading or math. An adaptive assessment is a test that automatically adjusts the difficulty of the questions according to each student's performance in order to determine his or her abilities in reading or math. Once your child completes the test, he or she will be assigned online instruction to support his or her progress in mastering each skill. 

Greater Giving Mobile Bidding via your smartphone or tablet is back for 2015! Here's what you need to know.

What is Mobile Bidding?

There are 3 basic functions of **Mobile Bidding – Browse**, **Bid**, and **Check**.

Browse – you can scroll through a list of Silent Auction items by category or enter an item number and jump right to that item. All from your seat at the table!

Bid – entering a bid is easy and fast. Just tap the item you want to bid on, tap the item's detail page, type in your bid, and press "Bid." If someone outbids you, you'll be sent a text message telling you that you have been outbid!

How It Works

- When you RSVP for the Auction, you will be asked to submit your cell phone number(s) and email address so to be entered into our Auction software.
- When you check-in at the Auction on Nov.
 7, you will be sent a message on your phone welcoming you to the Auction via that cell phone number.
- You will be able then to see our Silent Auction items by category and begin bidding simply by typing bids in on your phone.
- Each couple will have 1 bidder number, as we have done in the past, and can use that same bidder number to bid via 2 different phones or devices.
- After the tables close, an electronic receipt will be sent to the email address that you provided on your RSVP card.
 - If you scanned a credit card during registration, your balance will show \$0.
 - If you choose to pay by cash or check to save the school the credit card fees, then you will be shown your balance due and you can leave cash/check at the Check-out station when you leave.
- Don't have a smartphone or tablet we will have a table at the Auction with devices that you can use that night for bidding!
