Parent Tool Kit

7 Sentence Starters to use with Teachers

1. "I'm concerned about my child's..."

A less confrontational way of stating concerns. Using "I" statements instead of "you" statements makes it clear you want to work together and are on the same team and avoids the blame game.

2. "Help me understand..."

A constructive way even when you disagree with the teacher to create clarity and show willingness to listen.

3. "Have you considered..."

A polite way to share information the teacher may not know.

4. "I've noticed..."

This respectfully allows you to share information and acknowledge different perspectives.

5. "It seems as if _____ has a hard time doing _ when Useful words to share understanding about a children's strengths and needs are seems and appears. Ex. "She appears to not complete homework when the assignments involve multi-part directions."

6. "The IEP provides my child with _____. How does that look in the classroom?" Asking about accommodations without accusing the teacher of failing to provide them. The main goal is to work together. Key thing to remember is to avoid assumptions that can undermine your relationships.

7. "How can I help?"

This question lets a teacher know you're willing to play a role in your child's education.


