
## Two Big Bears

## **POLAR BEAR**

**Status** Vulnerable\* (not endangered, but facing a high risk of extinction)


**Population in the wild** 20,000 to 25,000

**Scientific name** *Ursus maritimus* 

Weight Up to 1,430 pounds

**Length** Up to 10 feet

**Habitat** Polar regions



## **BROWN BEAR**

**Status** Least concern\*

**Population in the wild** More than 200,000

**Scientific name** *Ursus arctos* 

Weight 440 to 770 pounds

**Length** 6.5 feet

**Habitats** Forests, polar regions, mountains
