

Ask Fr. Meyer

Please tell us more about the adjustments in the Wedding Guidelines?

I would like to answer questions about the Wedding Guidelines with a strong foundation. It is not about what "I" like or dislike. The Sacrament of Holy Matrimony is a *Rite* of the Roman Catholic Church. It is one of the Seven Sacraments. Thus, the Church prescribes what is and what is not allowed to take place. The problem with the celebration of Marriage, is that like many other sacraments in the Church in the past few decades, priests have allowed just about anything to take place, and it has left people with the idea that anything is allowed. But let me clarify, the liturgy and the Sacraments are not our Creative Playground. They are not something that we make-up or get out of a magazine or see on a T.V. show. They are not to be touching, sentimental, theme parties. They are intended to be beautiful encounters with God, by God and for God.

They 7 Sacraments are a gift from God, not a right that we have. Thus, they are directed from on high. And they are to be RECEIVED by us- not CREATED by us. This is a different and somewhat drastic notion of the sacraments. Many of us might not be used to this approach. But, it is what the Church expects. It is what I as a priest live day in and day out. I trust that 2,000 years of living tradition has served us well and that innovations often cause drastic problems. Because of this, I strive to celebrate each sacrament with reverence and devotion; strictly abiding to the Rites of the Church. I have found that people have a religious sense within them that finds this attractive. The Rites themselves are attractive! This is not just pertaining to holy matrimony, but to all 7 sacraments.

The sacrament of Holy Matrimony is not the only sacrament where the creativity of brides and their mothers has "sometimes" created a spectacle. The watering-down and secularization of the liturgy has taken place across the board. I have been to celebrations of Holy Mass that looked more like a circus than the last supper (even one where a priest wore a Snoopy vestment). I have been to Reconciliation Services that have caused actual fires that


involved fire-departments, but not the forgiveness of sins. I have been to baptisms that were so "dry" that I wondered if anything had happened. And I have been to first communions where the actual reception of our Lord's Sacred Body and Blood was the least significant part of the ceremony.

Yet, all of this was done with GOOD INTENTIONS. People are not intentionally trying to go against the Church. People are trying to create a meaningful experience, invoke emotions and make people feel good. The problem is that they often ended up making a mess and the bigger problem is that GOD is often put to the side, neglected and/or forgotten.

The thing that needs to be remembered is this: the Sacraments are more about *God working* than us *doing*. We are to receive Sacraments. We need to trust that what the Church offers is good enough. We do not need to add, create or manipulate the Church to get what we want. So, the golden principal is less is more and stick to the basics.

Now that we have a foundation; next week I will begin addressing some fun issues: Aisle Runners, Unity Candles, Unity Sand, Secular Music and Modest Dress, oh and let's not forget cohabitation.

Faith Formation Update

After being here at All Saints for 4 months I am delighted to see the many ways that your faith is passed on and shared. This is especially true in the lives of our young people. This past week the Vacation Bible School Program was a joy! However, with all things comes change. This fall there will be several adjustments made to the religious formation being offered at All Saints. Some of the adjustments are due to making life easier for parents (one location), some of them are programming decisions (Catechesis of the Good Shepherd for all 3 year olds - 6th graders and Confirmation for 9th and 10th graders), and some of them are financial (downsizing in staff). Here is a small introduction to these adjustments:

<u>3-Year old through 6th Grade</u>- All catechesis will be done in our *Catechesis of the Good Shepherd* program. This program, which has also been adopted by the All Saints Academy, will be offered every Wednesday evening and Sunday morning at the St. Joseph Campus. This program will be coordinated by Patsy Oehlman and several well trained catechists.

<u>7-8th Grade-</u>These young boys and girls will have classes available to them on Wednesday evenings and Sunday mornings at the St. Joseph Campus. The catechesis will be a traditional classroom style. The emphasis during these two years will be relationships, moral teachings and basic catechesis. Donn and Michelle Paquette will be coordinating these efforts with other assistants and catechists.

<u>9-10th Grade-</u> The sacrament of Confirmation will be made available to all incoming 9th and 10th graders. This will be a double year for us at All Saints, as confirmation was traditionally received in the 10th grade only. This class will be held on Wednesday nights (not Sunday mornings) at the St. Joseph Campus. Fr. Meyer and a group of adults will be leading this program.

<u>High School Youth Ministry-</u> With the success of this summer's Wild and Wacky Wednesday Nights we will be looking for continued opportunities for our High School aged youth to gather for catechesis, food, faith and fun. This schedule has not been set - look for upcoming information. Fr. Meyer will continue to coordinate these efforts.

<u>Calendars and Registration</u>- These will be coming out sooner than later. We would like to have people registered by the end of July if possible. All programs will be up and running by the beginning of September-Wednesday September 3rd.

<u>St. Joseph Campus</u>- All 3-year old through 10th grade faith formation will take place at the St. Joseph Campus on either Wednesday evening following the 5:45 PM Daily Mass or on Sunday mornings prior to the 11AM Weekend Mass.

This can be expressed in this fashion, God the FATHER so loved the world (His bride the Church, His children) that He gave his only son. It is a "father's" role to sacrifice, offer and give. We as men (fathers) are called to be men who give to our wife and children as God the Father does...every day.

Corpus Christi- A We eat the Body and Blood of Jesus, because He told us to. If we do not eat his Body and Blood, we do not get to go to heaven. We all want to go to heaven, so we should eat his body and blood as often as possible. Because we want more people to join us in heaven, we all need to become evangelizers of the Eucharist. We need to invite people to Mass and tell them what is says in the bible in John chapter 6- I am the living bread come down from heaven, whoever eats this Bread will live forever and the bread that I will give, is My flesh for the life of the word...unless you eat the Flesh of the Son of Man and drink His Blood, you do not have life within you!

Solemnity of Peter and Paul- ABC

These two men are put before us today due to the fact that they were great sinners who repented, and became great saints. This is our calling- to be saints. Once they found their calling to be saints they lived lives of great self-sacrifice for the sake of the Gospel. So much so, they were willing to die for the faith. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a religious education process for children ages 3 through 12 in which they experience and form an authentic, faithful relationship with God. Inspired by Maria Montessori's principles of education, the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program was created in 1954 in Rome by Dr. Sofia Cavalletti, a biblical scholar, and Professor Gianna Gobbi, a Montessori-trained educator of children and teachers.
