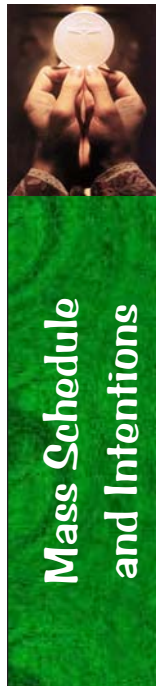

## Ask Fr. Meyer

### Why do you want a server to hold a plate under us at communion?

The question is asking about Communion Plates or what is sometimes referred to as Communion Patens. The English word plate in Latin is *paten*. The **General Instruction of the Roman Missal** is the text that, promulgated by the Vatican and retranslated in 2002, instructs the Church on how to celebrate Holy Mass. It covers everything from how an altar is to be constructed to how a priest is to hold his hands during the Our Father. In the section on *Mass with a Congregation* in paragraph 118 it states:

*The following are also to be prepared for Mass:*

*Next to the priest's chair: the Roman Missal and, as needed, a hymnal;*

*At the ambo: the Lectionary;*

*On the credence table: the chalice, a corporal, a purificator, and, if appropriate, the pall; the paten and, if needed, ciboria; bread for the Communion of the priest who presides, the deacon, the ministers, and the people; cruets containing the wine and the water, unless all of these are presented by the faithful in procession at the Offertory; the vessel of water to be blessed, if the asperges (sprinkling rite) occurs; **the Communion-plate for the Communion of the faithful**; and whatever is needed for the washing of hands.*

*It is a praiseworthy practice to cover the chalice with a veil, which may be either the color of the day or white.*

This text makes it clear that on credence table (side table) there are to be Communion-plates for the Communion of the faithful. This means that they are to be on the side table and thus are not an option. A **General Instruction** is not a suggestion but the instructions on how to do the bare-minimum. In fact the Vatican came out even stronger about Communion plates just a few years later in a document entitled **Redemptionis Sacramentum: On certain matters to be observed or to be avoided regarding the Most Holy Eucharist**. This was a document published in 2004. From its title, it is clear that it was written by the Vatican to attempt to stop liturgical abuses and encourage a deeper reverence

to Our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament. The document states in paragraph 93: *The Communion-plate for the Communion of the faithful should be retained, so as to avoid the danger of the sacred host or some fragment of it falling.*

This is why the Communion plate exists. It is to keep the host from falling on the ground or from the smallest particle-crumbs from falling on the ground. Because of The Gospel of St. John Chapter 6, the 3 accounts of the Last Supper in Matthew, Mark and Luke, our 2,000 year tradition and teaching about the True Presence of the Eucharist, and our understanding of transubstantiation-it is essential for us to have a great concern about the way each host and every particle of the Most Blessed Sacrament is cared for. To some this may seem absurd or scrupulous; however it is the teaching of our church and the universal liturgical practice we are asked to conform ourselves to.

Now I do realize that there are parishes that you have visited in our area or elsewhere where they do not follow the instruction of Holy Mother Church concerning this practice. We are not to judge, condemn or look down upon them. A good priest friend of mine always told me concerning the celebration of Holy Mass and priests and parishes who do not follow the universal laws; "they are not there yet, but we are on our way." After the 2<sup>nd</sup> Vatican Council a lot of things that were not intended to be gotten rid of; were. It is my intent to be as faithful as I can to what God asks of me, especially concerning the celebration of Holy Mass. May God be praised by what we do, and transform us into Himself.

## Homily Review

### **20<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time- A**

Our readings remind us that "ALL" people are called to worship Jesus and become one with Him. We are called to invite them into relationship with Jesus. However, prior to doing this, we need to be in proper relationship with Him, which requires a relationship rooted in prayer. A.C.T.S. on a consistent basis, in a regular location needs to be a part of our lives as Roman Catholics. So, we need to pray for the desire for prayer, the wanting to want God, and the longing to be with Him. This is often the first and most important prayer-to prayer for the desire to desire Him. The Canaanite woman had tremendous desire- may we have that same desire for Jesus.

### **21<sup>st</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time- A**

Who do people say that I am? This question, asked by Jesus, to the 12 apostles, is also asked to us. Our response should be one of three answers: Lord, Lunatic or Liar. If we look at the bible and the historical narrative that goes with the scriptures, Jesus made the claim that He was God. So, what is our response to His claim? Either He is God, or He claims to be and knows he is not (a Liar), or he thinks he is, but is not (Lunatic). So, who is he? What do you think?

### **22<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time- A**

Do not be conformed to this age, but be transformed ~ Romans 12. What is "this age" all about: Hedonism (If it feels good do it- the love of pleasure- food, drink, lust), Individualism (It's all about me), Materialism (How much more stuff can I get) and Minimalism (What is the least I can do). The opposite is the Gospel- moderation and penance, community and other, giving and detachment, striving for greatness and offering all we have. We are called to "transform" the spirit of this age and live the Gospel. To do so, we will be counter-cultural and will have to carry our cross with our Lord. May we strive to transform and not conform!

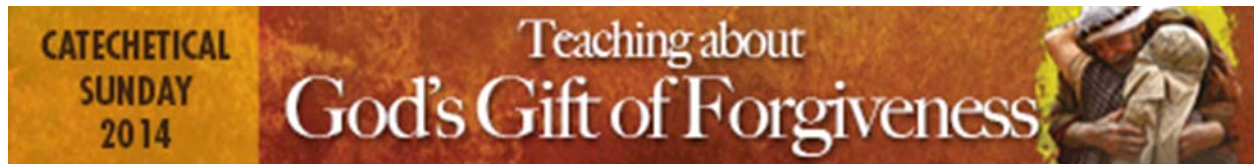


