## **GENERAL**

**Sportsmanship**: The game of hockey is meant to be played with passion and effort but also within the rules of good sportsmanship and respect for others.

**SIRCH Pond Hockey**: The Pond Hockey Festival is an outdoor event and will be held regardless of weather conditions

## Rules

\*Teams will consist of 6 players. Two substitutes, four players on the ice and changes on the fly.

\*No goaltender

\*Games will be 30 minutes in duration 2 15-minute running time periods with a 5 minute break

\*Guaranteed three games per team with playoff Sunday

\*Schedule to be posted Tuesday February 21st

\*Rinks to measure approximately 135' by 65'

\*Surface will be shovelled in between games if needed

\*All players must wear skates and helmets. Other protective equipment is recommended but optional

\*No goalie equipment or goal sticks permitted

\*All teams must have white (home) and dark (away) shirt.

\*There will be one off-ice pond official to monitor the play (scoring, time, puck drop and reset and arbitrator of infractions)

\*Penalties will be called for rule infractions. Penalties called on honour system. A minor penalty will result in a goal awarded to the opposing team as well as possession of puck.

\*Any major penalties which include any action that could possibly injure another player will result in ejection from the game. The off-ice pond official will determine major penalties.

\*Abusing of official will be considered a major penalty. This includes yelling, swearing or arguing about calls

\*No body checking allowed. Such action will result in a minor penalty, unless deemed serious enough to result in a major penalty.

- \*Players cannot fall on the ice to protect the goal area. This will be a minor penalty.
- \*Players cannot lay their sticks down to protect the goal area. This will be a minor penalty
- \*If ball goes out of bounds the last team to touch it loses possession. During restart defence must give two stick lengths of space.
- \*There will be no off sides or icing calls
- \*Goals must be scored from the attacking side of center ice
- \*Teams must give their opponents  $\frac{1}{2}$  the ice after a goal is scored or an infraction takes place
- \*There are no overtime periods in round robin play. During championship games, teams will play three minute overtime. The team that scores the most will be declared the winner. If the score remains tied at the end of the three minute overtime, play will continue unabated and the first team to score wins.
- \*Teams are not allowed to lift the ball off the ice no more than 12 inches; doing so will result in the opposing team taking possession.
- \*No Slap shots. Stick blades must remain on the ice at all times
