The heart of the Fredericton SPCA just got bigger thanks to Matt, Lisa, Nicole, Alicia and Chandler Stairs. Retired major league baseball hero Matt Stairs has been the Community Ambassador for the organization for the past few years but for 2016 the entire family has stepped up to the plate.

"Animal welfare is important to us as a family," says Lisa, "so it seems so appropriate for us to volunteer to take on this position together." Matt agrees. "Our pets are members of our family and bring us a lot of joy. If there is anything we can do together to improve the lives of other homeless animals, we're here to help," he adds.

Matt and Lisa have raised over \$150,000 for the Fredericton SPCA in the past four years through the annual Matt Stairs Golf Tournament which shares the profits with the Fredericton Minor Baseball Association. This effort has helped keep the annual euthanasia rate to less than two percent while the national average is 17 percent for dogs and 37 percent for cats. It also supports a behaviour modification program and daily enrichment activities.

"The Stairs family is the epitome of philanthropy," says Scott Elliott, President of the Board of Directors of the FSPCA. "They set a standard for community involvement and we are thrilled that the entire family will be representing our organization as Community Ambassadors." ...continued on page 3

TINA'S STORY A SIGNIFICANT CASE OF PET OBESITY



BACKGROUND: A severely obese cat was recently taken to the Fredericton SPCA by a local animal control officer. The female cat has an unknown history but it is suspected that she has been living under an enclosed structure.

The cat was taken to the Hometown Veterinary Hospital in Fredericton shortly after arrival. She was named "Tina" as a similar case of obesity occurred at the Fredericton SCPA in 2012 with a cat named "Tiny".

At a staggering, 38lbs, Tina's health was compromised upon arrival. "She completely filled the cage," said Fredericton SPCA supervisor, Andrea Stone, about Tina's arrival. "I was very worried for this cat. I didn't think she would survive," explained Stone.

Tina's journey to achieving a healthy weight will be a one that takes time. "Tina has a long road to recovery ahead of her and we have to closely monitor her health during her weight loss," said Dr. Chelsie Armstrong, who has been one of Tina's primary caregivers

Hi everyone – I thought I would give you an update on how I'm doing. I've made a new friend named Annie. You can see her in the picture with me. She is pretty nice but has a lot more energy than I do.

Now, to my weight loss journey update -

I have been having a difficult time but am currently down to 16kg! Every ounce I lose is a celebration. Did you know it's really tough on the body when cats lose weight? So I'm excited to be inching to the 16kg mark.

It is hard for me to exercise because I am in a lot of pain from my hips and knees, so the main way I have to lose weight right now is through my diet. I get weighed every day and this helps us know how many calories I take in and how many calories that come out (I know, gross!). We do this so we know how much I can eat. It seems that my metabolism has finally kick-started because this has

been the first week since I started my diet that I have lost an ounce or two with every weigh in. Like I said, a big celebration! It's been a slow, steady process but I am happy to finally be getting over this hump. Anyways, thank you for your kind words of encouragement.





I was lost, and I had been hit by a car, so I had lots of injuries to one side of my body. Luckily I found some nice kids who were out walking their dog, and they and their mom brought me into the FSPCA. Once they saw me, the girls there knew I needed to see a vet, and took me to go get looked at right away. Turns out I had a broken jaw, a fractured back leg, and an injured ligament in my front leg that made it hard to use it or walk on it. I had to have several surgeries to get myself put back together, and had to get wires put in my jaw while I healed. The wires that held my jaw together were secured by a button, and that is how I got my name! Now I am healed and my button is gone, but my foster mom says it's a good name because I am still as cute as a button!

After the nice people at the vet fixed me up, I went to live in a foster home while I recovered. I was so happy to have somewhere warm to sleep, and to have yummy food every day to eat. I even started doing some arm stretches with my foster mom, and guess what? I can use almost the whole thing now! I am still working on getting movement back in my paw, but everyone is very excited with how well I am doing! I am excited too, and I love to tell people stories when I see them. I heard some of the girls say that I am a miracle, and I think I agree. I also heard the girls say that Tiny's Medical Fund helps cats like me who need a lot of work get better, so I think that is a miracle too!

I am happy I came to the FSPCA, because now that I am better they are helping me find a furever home – somewhere that I will always have a soft spot to sleep, people to talk to, and someone to love and take care of me.
