Council Minutes August 2011



COUNCIL MINUTES AUGUST 2, 2011

The Village of Barboursville met Tuesday, August 2, 2011 at 7:30 p.m. in the Community Center with all members present. Mayor Turman called the meeting to order and Chief Mike Coffey gave the invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance.

MINUTES FROM: JULY 19, 2011

Councilman Plybon made the motion to dispense with the reading of the regular Council minutes from July 5, 2011 and that they be approved as presented. Councilman Hockenberry seconded. Motion carried.

UPDATES AND COMMENTS:

Public Works Director Steve Parsons' report the updates since the last Council meeting.

Created additional parking in the alley off from the 800 block of Barbara Street.

Installed rip/rap on Yoak Ave between Wilson St and Russell Drive.

Worked on the road to the Lift Station next to the Pool. Completed the work on the soft spots in the road on Highland Park Drive.

Completed the electrical work on the storage building for the new Can Am Motorcycle at the city garage and electricity for Gus' kennel.

Poured new curbs on McClung Avenue.

Cleaned out Tanyard Branch behind Samuels Avenue
Cleaned out and flushed various catch basins around the Village.

Completed the general clean up and pick up of trash as well as running the street sweeper.

OLD BUSINESS: None

NEW BUSINESS:

Recommendation of Sites for EMS Station for the Barboursville Area

Mayor Turman reported that he met with Commissioner Bailey and Gordon Merry today for several hours to tour the properties in the Barboursville area that were available for the proposed EMS Station. Mayor Turman showed them six pieces of property and explained the acreage and price for each piece of property. The Cabell County Commission will meet on Thursday, August 4, 2011.

Mayor Turman also reported that last Wednesday, July 27, 2011 we met with Commissioners Cartmill and Bailey, Gordon Merry as well as Councilman



Tatum concerning properties that would be available for the Commission to build the proposed EMS Station. There were questions concerning why the EMS Station was built in Milton last year if the Barboursville area receives the most number of calls in Cabell Co. Mayor Turman said that of all the properties shown today, Gordon Merry said that he preferred the property on Riverview Drive, owned by Deer Creek Enterprises partners, Jeff Jones and Randy Shepherd. Gordon Merry said that the Sheriff's Dept needed two additional storage bays for their vehicles, at the EMS Station. He also said that the EMS site needed to be a one and one half to two acres size lots.

Recommendation of Sites for the EMS Station for the Barboursville Area – cont'

At this time Mayor Turman made the motion
A. Motion to authorize the Mayor to continue his efforts to assist EMS Director Gordon Merry and the Cabell County Commission, to locate suitable sites for an EMS Station in the Barboursville Area (Area includes not only the Village, but East and West Pea Ridge, Guyan Estates, Timberlake, Mt. Vernon Circle, Williamsburg Colony, Martha, the Huntington and Merritt Creek Malls, Exits 15, 18 and 20 of I-64, Rt. 60 from HIMG to Fudges Creek and Alternate 10 and Rt. 10 to Salt Rock. More than 2000 calls completed last year by EMS within the Barboursville Area).

Also my motion is that council not lease or sale any of the twenty (20) acre commercial brickyard site to the EMS Station because it could jeopardize the sale of the whole twenty (20) acre site to a single business. Several companies have expressed interest in the twenty (20) acre site and they do not want other companies or buildings on the property.

Recommended EMS Station sites

1. RBC, owned by Ron Foster has about ten (10) acres for sale adjacent to the Village's twenty (20) acre commercial site. (\$140,000.00/acre Riverview Drive)
2. Jeff Jones has four (4) acres for sale adjacent to Bill Simpson and Jim Cain's apartments. (\$150,000.00/acre Riverside Drive)
3. First Sentry Bank has property for lease adjacent to the bank at Merritt Creek. (\$4,200.00/mo Access to I-64 and Rt. 60)

Brent Adams has two (2) acres for lease. (\$4,000.00/month Rt. 60 and Water Street)

5. The Village has two (2) acres adjacent to the gun range at the Soccer Complex in the Village Park that could be leased for \$1.00/year for the EMS Station One (1) acre of property located at Main Street and Depot St belonging to CSX that the Village currently leases for \$180.00/year. The Village would sublease for \$1.00/year, if the Commission is able to get CSX permission to build EMS Station on site. Councilman Tatum seconded the motion.

Discussion: Commissioner Cartmill reported that Gordon Merry has been very frugal and that is the reason he had a one million two hundred thousand dollar carry over last year, and even with the carry over they did not have the money in the budget to purchase property. Mayor Turman said he understood the problem and that he realizes we need this EMS Station but can't recommend that we GIVE property to the county. He reported that he has talked with many residents that feel he should not give tax payers property to the county. Several residents including Paul Barrett, 1009 College Ave, Kitty Spradling, 1124 Main Street, Tiffany Stark, 100 Merritt Street and Chad Ward, 103 McConkey Avenue expressed their opinion on the EMS Station. At this time the vote was taken: Spencer – yes, Tatum – no, Hall- yes, Miller – yes, Turman – yes, Hockenberry – yes, Plybon – no. Motion approved.

Mayor Turman said that he would continue to work with Gordon Merry to assist in finding a suitable piece of property for the EMS Station.

Hiring New Police Officer – Daniel Mulvaney

At this time Mayor Turman made the motion to go into Excessive Session in order to discuss the hiring of a new Police Officer, Daniel Mulvaney. Councilman Hall seconded. Motion carried. The time was 8:00 p.m. Mayor Turman reconvened the regular Council meeting at 8:18 p.m., reporting that no action was taken during the Executive Session.

At this time Recorder, Kandy Miller asked to be excused to attend a meeting with the West Virginia Municipal League Conference.

Mayor Turman made the motion to hire **Daniel Mulvaney** based on Chief Coffey's recommendation because he scored in the top four on his written exam and the physical fitness test.

Daniel also passed all the testing required for incoming police officers such as his polygraph & psychological evaluations. We will hire Daniel Mulvaney and send him to the State Police Academy for required training. Councilman Tatum seconded. Plybon – yes, Hockenberry – yes, Turman – yes, Hall – yes, Tatum- yes, Spencer – yes. Motion carried.

COUNCIL COMMENTS:

Councilman Hall said he felt that the Main St and Depot St property would be the best property for the new EMS Station. The Village has leased this property from CSX since 1961 and if the Cabell Co commission could work out the details the Village would relinquish our lease so that they could have this property.

Councilman Hockenberry expressed his distain in how the EMS station discussion has played out in the media. He said the Village and the Cabell Co Commission need to work together to locate a suitable site for the EMS Station.

Councilman Plybon asked for a "Handicapped" sign in front of his house. Steve Parsons informed Council that we can not place "Handicapped" signs in residential area. Councilman Plybon also congratulated the Girls Softball team for their performance during the semi final games in Georgia.

Councilman Hall said that he thought that everyone on the present Council ran supporting the Multi Purpose Facility and we need the tax base from the sale of the Brickyard property in order to build the center. The Cabell County Commission and the 911 EMS properties would not pay any taxes to the Village of Barboursville.

VISITORS:

Paul Barrett, 1009 College Avenue, expressed his concern about tree limbs and grass being put in Tanyard Branch behind Thelma Hall's house. Steve said that he would take care of this problem.

A resident from Peyton Street was concerned about the excess recycling that piles up in front of and around the recycling bins. Goodwill is scheduled to pick up twice a week but even at twice a week they seem always to be full, especially on Saturday.

There being no further business to come before Council, the meeting was adjourned. The time was 8:40 p.m.

AUGUST 16, 2011

The Village of Barboursville met Tuesday, Aug 16, 2011 at 7:30 p.m. in the Community Center with all members present. Mayor Turman called the meeting to order and Chief Mike Coffey gave the invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance.

MINUTES FROM: AUGUST 2, 2011

Councilman Tatum made the motion to dispense with the reading of the regular Council minutes from August 2, 2011 and that they be approved as presented.

Councilman Plybon seconded. Motion carried.

UPDATES AND COMMENTS:

Public Works Director Steve Parsons' report the updates since the last Council meeting.

Completed the widening of the curve on Greenwood Way and poured curbs, now trucks especially a fire truck will be able to maneuver Greenwood Way, also cleaned out catch basins.

A manhole on Greenwood Way was also lowered and a smaller ring and lid were installed for better drainage. Trees were trimmed on Blake Street, Coffman Street and Peyton Street.

Tree limbs were cut and removed due to a storm from the storage building on the Veteran's Parking lot.

Repair work was completed on the fountain in the Cartmill Garden Park.

The water spigot was replaced and a shut off valve installed at the Little League Football Park.

The "stop lines" were replaced with heat tape within the Village of Barboursville.

Completed the general clean up and pick up of trash as well as running the street sweeper.

Completed six (6) Work Order Requests

OLD BUSINESS: None

NEW BUSINESS: Salt Contract 2011- 2012

Finance Director, Diana Roy reported that this year the contract for salt from North American Salt Company is for 140 tons at a cost of \$66.80 per ton (\$1.00 more than last years contract).

Our contract allows for 140 tons but only requires that we purchase 80% if the weather doesn't require that we need all 140 tons. Councilman Spencer made the motion to authorize the Village of Barboursville to sign contract for 140 tons of salt at \$66.80 per ton with an 80% required purchase.



Councilman Tatum seconded. Hockenberry- yes, Plybon-yes, Turman – yes, Miller – yes, Hall- yes, Tatum – yes, Spencer – yes. Motion carried.

Resolution – WV Development Office #11LEDA0012 Civil War Days \$5,000.00

Recorder, Kandy Miller explained that this is the procedure for receiving monies through the West Virginia Development Grant office. This grant will be for the 2012 Barboursville Civil War Days Event. Kandy Miller made the motion to accept this Resolution for the WV Development Office for \$5,000.00 for the Barboursville Civil War Days Event. Councilman Hall seconded. Spencer – yes, Tatum – yes, Hall-yes, Miller – yes, Turman – yes, Hockenberry – yes, Plybon – yes. Motion approved.

Recommendation from Park Board:

VOB Sponsor the Annual Civil War Days

Chairman of the Park Board, Jack McKenna made the recommendation from the Barboursville Park Board that the City Council approve and sponsor the annual Civil War Days that is held each year at the Barboursville Community Park. Jack explained that this year was the fifth year for the activities, it is an established event and that Linda Miller (coordinator) is having health issues and this would be very similar to how the city handles Fall Fest. Councilman Hall made the motion to accept the Park Board's recommendation to assume the sponsorship of the Barboursville Civil War Day event. Councilman Hockenberry seconded. Plybon – yes, Hockenberry – yes, Turman – yes, Miller – yes, Hall – yes, Tatum - yes, Spencer – yes. Motion carried.

Recommendation from Park Board

Rules and Regulations for events at the Park

Chairman, Jack McKenna informed Council that the Park Board members have worked for several months constructing and revising rules and regulations for all events held at the Barboursville Community Park. The Park Board recommends that City Council approve the rules and regulations.

Recorder, Kandy Miller said the rules and regulations are given to all persons planning an event at the Park (5K runs, walks, concerts etc). It has saved the office employees, time on the phone and it has helped place the responsibility of clean up with the organization and not extra work on the park employees.

Mayor Turman made the motion to accept the Park Board's recommendation of the Rules and Regulations of the Barboursville Community Park. Councilman Hockenberry seconded. Plybon – yes, Hockenberry- yes, Turman – yes, Miller – yes, Hall- yes, Tatum – yes, Spencer – yes. Motion carried.

COUNCIL COMMENTS:

Councilman Hall reported that there is poison ivy in the shrubs, beside the parking lot used by the Library on Main Street.

Steve reported that he has talked with ZBA and they are going to spray the scrubs.

Councilman Hockenberry expressed that he would like to see more local girls participate in the Fall Fest Pageant. He also said that he would like to see some type of signage constructed for community events.

Recorder, Kandy Miller reported the entertainment for the 30th Anniversary Fall Fest has been finalized. Friday evening performers will be a show band called The Avalons and Savannah Jack. Saturday evening's entertainment will be the winner of the Karaoke contest and The McClymonts, three sisters from Australia.

She also reported the Barboursville Fall Fest Pageant went very well and that our **2011 Fall Fest Queen** is **Elizabeth Blair Goodall** from Mooresville, WV and the **2011 Fall Fest Teen Queen** is **Lexsey Marrara** from Morgantown, WV. They are two beautiful girls that will represent the Village of Barboursville during our Fall Fest Celebration.

Councilman Tatum reported that the committee that was formed to talk and negotiate with Comcast has been meeting and Comcast has agreed to several of their requests.



He will have the final draft of our Franchise Agreement by our next Council meeting.

Councilman Plybon wanted to thank the organizers of the Tractor Show for their work for the event. It grows larger every year. He also asked about the bids for the tennis courts. Mayor Turman reported that bids were opened on Friday, August 12, 2011. There was only one bid and it was substantial. We are still reviewing the bid package.

VISITORS:

Jack McKenna, 793 Mohawk Drive expressed his concern about the speeding in the Barboursville Park and ask if there was any way we could install one of the electronic speed signs in the park.

Steve said he did have a portable sign that he would check and see if we were allowed to use it at the Park.

Dwayne Walters, #2 Adams Road, wanted to thank the Village of Barboursville and the Park Employees for allowing Bike BFAT (the mountain bike group that he rides with) to keep the trails open for biking.

He also expressed his concern for Mr. Eustace Blake and said that he missed seeing him at the Park.

Mayor Turman also reported that Eustace was in the office one day this week and looked really good and that he had started his treatments and we all wished him well and look forward to seeing him.

There being no further business to come before Council, the meeting was adjourned. The time was 8:15 p.m.

Police Department Information

For the month of July 2011 we have the following stats: There were 47 offenses reported and 19 adults arrested totaling 20 charges, 12 for shoplifting, 1 for drug related offenses, 1 for driving under the influence, 1 for public intoxication, 2 for transferring and receiving stolen property, and 3 for warrant service.. There were 92 citations issued. There were 9 juveniles arrested, 7 for shoplifting and 2 for obstructing. There were 34 vehicle crash reports involving 63 vehicles, 98 occupants, and 17 injuries. Through June 2011 we have the following stats: 400 offenses, 210 individual arrests with 331 charges, 54 juvenile arrest charges and 738 citations issued. Accidents investigated: 201 involving 374 vehicles, 568 occupants and 67 injuries. The Police Department welcomes **Daniel Mulvaney**. Officer Mulvaney replaces the vacant position of retiring Corporal C. O. Burks. Corporal Burks retired a few months ago due to health issues. Officer Mulvaney will be attending the next class at the West Virginia State Police Academy beginning in September of this year. School has started and again we remind motorists to adhere to the speed limits in town especially those surrounding the schools. Parents and/or guardians are reminded the McClung Street drop off for students does not include the residential parking area of the apartments.



Please **DO NOT** block the cross walk or park in the apartment complex parking to walk your child into the school. The parking lot at City Hall can be used to park and walk your child to school. Also on the Central Avenue side of the school there is a **NO LEFT TURN** during school hours. Traffic is backed up coming into the school from the opposite direction and turning left will completely stop traffic both ways. This may be an inconvenience to those coming from that direction, but traffic cannot stop. The school is directly in front of the Fire Dept and emergency vehicles must have the ability to respond to emergencies at all times. Friendly reminder also that Barboursville has a juvenile curfew. Sunday through Thursday juveniles must be off the streets by 11:00 PM and Friday and Saturday by 1:00 AM. Fall Fest is fast approaching and the police department will be adding extra patrol for the event. Anyone seeing mischief or suspicious activity should call 9-1-1.

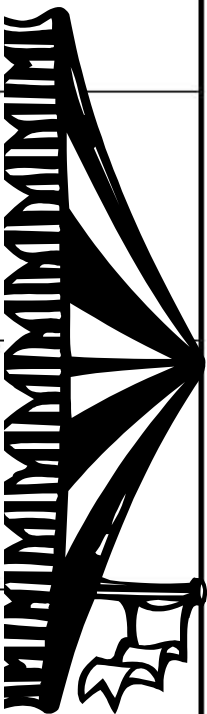






Barboursville Volunteer Fire Department News



BARBOURSVILLE VOL. FIRE DEPT.

Things have gotten a lot busier over the past month for our fire department. We were called out as many as 7 times in one day. The calls ranged from fire alarms, vehicle fires, vehicle accidents and to assist other depts. Recently our dept as well as a rescue truck from the Huntington Fire Dept assisted Ohio River Rd VFD with an accident on Rt. 2. The vehicle had gone over the guardrail, down an embankment and across a set railroad tracks. The driver was heavily entrapped causing it to be a difficult extraction. CSX was contacted in order to stop all trains coming down the line while we were working the scene. After a short time the patient was extricated and transported by Cabell Co EMS with critical injuries. All three depts worked well together.

We responded to two structure fires and an electrical fire in the past five days. The first fire was an abandoned trailer on Spring Rd off of Darnell Rd. 911 received multiple calls from neighbors reporting the fire and that it was possibly spreading to other trailers. We arrived on the scene quickly and asked for assistance from Green Valley and Ohio River Rd VFDs. The trailer was a complete loss but the fire did not spread to any other structures. One home did sustain some heat damage. The fire was determined to be suspicious due to the fact there were no utilities going to the trailer and it had been abandoned for a long time. The second fire happened in the 6800 block of Left Fork Merritt Creek Rd. Upon arrival of the Chief, he found a one story house with heavy smoke coming from the eaves. The tenant was out of the house but stated that one dog was still inside. The fire was in the attic so there was no smoke in the house and the dog was safely removed. The fire was confined to the attic but the house sustained a lot of water damage. We were able to salvage a lot of pictures, some clothing and personal items for the tenant and her children. We asked the Red Cross to assist the family. The fire occurred around 10 a.m. and we had Ona and Ohio River Rd VFDs assist with the supply line and provide extra manpower. This fire was an accidental electrical fire that started in the bathroom light fixture. Sadly, the tenant did NOT have renter's insurance.



I would like to remind anyone who rents or knows someone who rents a house or apartment to call your insurance agent and ask about renters insurance. This insurance is not expensive usually ranging from \$13 - \$20 per month depending on the amount of coverage you elect. Please remember the landlord or building owner does not provide insurance on your belongings only the structure itself.

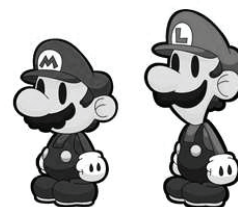
We did have a small fire in the ceiling at Talbot's in the Huntington Mall. It was contained to some insulation that had caught fire due to welding being done by construction workers. Two stores had smoke in them and one worker was transported to the hospital with smoke inhalation. In another incident there was a small electrical conduit fire in the floor by the Disney Store. The electric was shut off and we closed the corridor while the construction workers dug up the flooring and made sure the fire did not spread to any other areas. As our pre-plans for the mall, whenever we get a report of any type of fire in the mall we have three other fire depts respond, due to the number of things that have to be done. In the event of a large fire or incident, every fire dept in Cabell Co responds as well as a few units from the Huntington Fire Dept. Hopefully, we do not have any more incidents while the mall is being renovated.

School has started and there are children everywhere, please drive safely through our town and keep an extra eye out during school time. We do not want to have any accident due to someone's recklessness. Fire prevention will be starting soon for all of the elementary schools and daycares. We are looking forward to teaching fire safety to the new children and refreshing the memories of the ones we have taught before.

Please take a few minutes to check your smoke detectors, practice your home fire drills and call your insurance agent about renter's insurance if you rent.

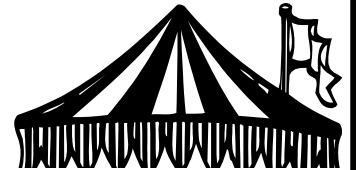
