## MATHLETICS

### Your Mathletics is about to receive an exciting update!

This update will improve the Mathletics experience for your child and their teacher at school and at home, incorporating a range of engaging and educationally beneficial enhancements. In particular, the Student Centre will receive a complete overhaul, giving students a fresh, new and even more enjoyable experience to ensure they stay excited about learning with Mathletics. These changes have been tested with schools over the last few weeks and the feedback from students has been that they love it!

To ensure the seamless transition, here are some helpful tips to give the best possible head start for your child using Mathletics at home:

- With the huge amount of student data transferring across to our new system we've found it best to switch off the weekly parent email report feature off for the moment.
- Home Spellodrome licences that are linked to a school Mathletics licence will temporarily not be available. With the incredible number of Mathletics users switching to the enhanced Mathletics site, the priority is to ensure that all Mathletics users are ready to go. Home Spellodrome accounts will follow shortly.
- The update to Mathletics takes advantage of Flash 10. This is a quick software update that is simply installed on your home computer by visiting <http://get.adobe.com/flashplayer/> and clicking Download Now (note you may want to deselect the Free Google Toolbar option first).
- If you are a Mac user, Mathletics is best experienced through the Firefox web browser. The software and installation instructions are available at <http://www.mozilla.com/en-US/products/download.html?product=firefox-4.0.1&os=win&lang=en-GB>

We are going to have 4 sessions in term 4 and will be running every week on Tuesday as we want all children who returned their form to participate, otherwise too many children will miss out.

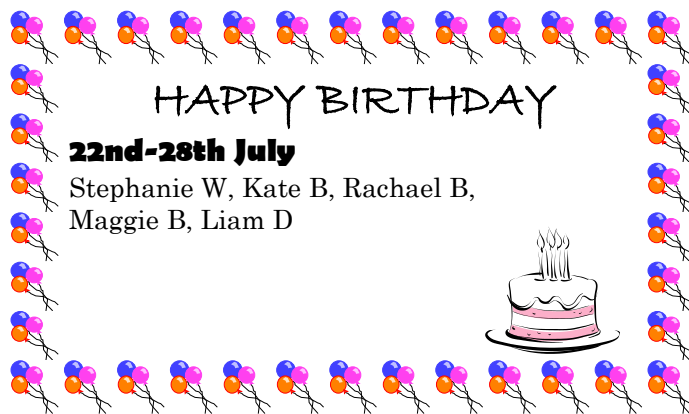

**Re: Donvale Indoor Sports Centre (DISC) - Car Parking**

Thank you for your letter dated 14 June 2011, asking Council to erect 'Reverse Park during school hours' signs within the Donvale Indoor Sports Centre (DISC) car park in Donvale, to improve safety within the car park.

Unfortunately, Council cannot require drivers to reverse park, as reverse parking is not part of the Victorian Road Rules. Council officers will talk to the school principal and teachers and if the proposal is supported by the school and the majority of parents, Council will consider erecting the signs in the car park, as a trial. Although this is an option, Council cannot make it compulsory if parents choose not to reverse park into the bays.

In the meantime, Council officers will inspect the site and see if anything else can be done to improve parking and safety.

## **MATHS FUN FOR EVERYONE**

### **How far do you ride your bike?**

#### **You will need**

Bike and helmet  
Playing card or a piece of cardboard  
Sticky tape  
Tape measure

#### **What to do**

Measure the distance around the tyre on the front wheel of your bike.

Tape a playing card to one of the spokes on the front wheel of your bike. You want the card to stick out the side of the wheel so that it hits the fork of the bike every time the wheel comes around.

Lift up the front of your bike and spin the front wheel. You want it to spin freely, but you also want to be able to hear the card hitting the frame of the bike every time the wheel spins around. If the wheel doesn't spin freely, try using softer card, or stick the card closer to the tyre than the centre of the wheel.

If the card doesn't hit the frame every time it comes around, try using a longer piece of cardboard.

If the noise isn't loud enough, then try using several cards stuck to the same spoke, or use a larger piece of cardboard.

Go for a slow bike ride. While you're riding, count how many times the card hits the frame. If you multiply this by the distance around your wheel, you'll get the distance you've ridden.

This activity is a lot easier if you can count quickly. Try only saying the first syllable of the numbers you are counting, and only say the tens value on that count. For example, counting from 26 would be "six, sev, eight, nine, thirty (or thirt), one, two ..."

Another trick for counting quickly is to imagine what the numbers look like, not what they sound like. This can be difficult, but with practice can be very fast.

#### **What's happening?**

In this activity, you are turning your bike into a trundle wheel. A trundle wheel is a measuring wheel on a stick that you push along the ground to measure the length of a path. On some trundle wheels, the wheel clicks every time it turns around and completes a revolution, and on most of them, a counter keeps track of how many times the wheel has turned.

#### **Applications**

In this activity, a noise is made every time the wheel completes a revolution. You can buy bicycle computers that can tell you how far and how fast you ride which work in a similar way. These computers have a magnet that you put on a spoke and a switch or detector that you put on the frame of the bike. Every time the wheel spins, the magnet passes the switch and completes the circuit. The computer can count this and work out how far you've travelled.

There are many advantages to using a computer to count the wheel revolutions. Firstly, computers are very good at counting, so you can ride as fast as you like and you won't lose count. Secondly, the computer can do calculations as you ride, so you can see how far you've gone at any time. Thirdly, the computer can work out how often the wheel spins and that means it can work out how fast you are going, as well as how far.

If you don't have a measuring tape, you can measure the tyre with a string, and then measure the string with a ruler.



Tape the card so it will hit the bike's frame once per revolution.

# **Donvale Primary School The Arts Policy**

## **1 Policy Statement**

The Arts covers the disciplines of Art, Dance, Drama, Media, Music and Visual Communication. Learning in the Arts allows students to communicate their perceptions, observations and understanding of structures, functions and concepts drawn from other domains.

Learning in the Arts is sequential and students should have continuous experience in the different Arts disciplines. At levels 1 and 2, all students should experience learning in performing and visual disciplines. By level 4 the study of a range of Arts disciplines broadens and deepens students' understanding of the Arts as an area of human activity and provides increased opportunities for personal expression and communication.

## **2 Rationale**

Through an arts program students:

- develop their intellectual, imaginative and expressive potential
- develop skills, techniques and a knowledge of processes as a basis for personal expression
- create, perform or present arts works
- develop critical skills and an understanding of aesthetics
- develop understanding of how the arts evolve within social, cultural and historical contexts
- enjoy participating in the processes of creating, presenting and responding to the arts.

## **3 Implementation**

- All students at our school will experience sequential Art, Music, Dance, Drama, Media and Visual Communication disciplines based on the VELS.
- The school will appoint an Art teacher who will provide Art, Media and Visual Communication programs.
- The school will appoint a Performing Arts teacher who will provide Music, Drama and Dance programs. The school will continue to offer private instrumental music tuition to students whose parents wish to pay for the service.
- All Arts staff members will plan and implement lessons based on the VELS, working in conjunction with each other, and where possible, drawing on experiences and knowledge from other domains.
- A student's individual abilities will be considered so that learning opportunities can be provided that cater for their identified needs.
- Student progress in the Arts will be reported in half and end of year academic reports and student portfolios.
- Budgets that provide for the needs of the various Arts program will be developed annually by the Arts staff.
- The Arts teachers will be responsible for coordinating the various community musical, visual and performing arts activities that occur each year.
- Students in levels 2 to 4 will be given opportunities to participate in optional choir, recorder, and small instrumental groups.
- Performing Arts groups will be encouraged to perform at assemblies, Open Days and other special occasions or venues.
- Visual Arts materials and equipment is available for use by classroom teachers in consultation with the Visual Arts teacher.
- Children's art work will be displayed in the school, to promote children's pride in their work and promote the value of children's work to the wider community.

## **Evaluation and Review**

This policy is to be reviewed every three years, or following referral by School Council.

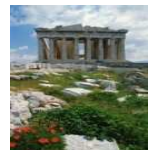
