

- Riders entered only in these classes are exempt from the Federation membership requirements and are not required to pay a non-member fee but are required to list the Federation membership number if the participant is a member.
- Horses entered in these classes are exempt from the Federation fee, including the Equine Drugs and Medication fee.
- Horses are not required to have a Horse Identification (HID) or Recording Number but are to list the HID or Recording number if the horse has been assigned a number.
- Cross entries into the rated/recognized classes are allowed. If Rider/Horse cross enters into a rated class, all applicable fees and membership requirements apply.





RULES AND REGULATIONS

- DRESSAGE AT GREYSTONE is governed by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book and the current USDF Region Rule Book. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current Federation rulebook will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.
- 2. Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division: and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.
- 3. ENTRIES; All entries close on June 4, 2010. Correct fees and association numbers must accompany each entry form. ATTENTION COMPETITIORS: Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct association numbers (USEF, USDF) for horse, owner, rider, trainer, and coach, before the day of competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.
- 4. LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED, if schedule allows.
- 5. REFUNDS: There will be positively no refunds after the closing date. Only Scratches due to medical reasons and supported with documentation (Doctors note) will be refunded in full except for the non-refundable office fee. Scratches made prior to the closing date will be refunded. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to call (931) 527-0215 before the closing date to be eligible for a refund.
- 6. CHANGES ON ENTRIES AFTER RIDE TIMES ARE ISSUED MAY RESULT IN A CHANGE FEE. All changes on the entry form after the closing date will be subject to a fee of \$10.00 per change requested. All changes will be subject to approval by Show Management.
- 7. CONDITIONS OF ENTRY: Every horse and pony entered for competition will be under the control of the horse Show Management, but the Horse Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show, it's Directors, and Employees, USEF, it's Directors and Employees harmless for any loss or accident to his horse, horses or equipment which may occur from accident, sickness, fire or otherwise. Management reserves the right to cancel, combine or **divide classes**, or to change officials as it deems necessary, decision of Show Management is final. Ride times will be available on the website by June 24, 2010. Failure to enter ring by scheduled time may incur elimination. This is the responsibility of the exhibitor. Score sheets will only be given to riders or their authorized representative after results have been posted.
- 8. CLASS LIST INFORMATION: CLASSES ARE RECOGNIZED BY THE US Equestrian Federation and the USDF. Opportunity classes are unrecognized. Management reserves the right to combine classes.
- 9. ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES: Entries will be accepted by mail, digitally or other means of delivery postmarked or dated sent by June 4, 2010, hand delivered Entries must be received by June 3, 2010 by 6:00pm. No other criteria will be ACCEPTED. Entries and Payment must be received by closing date whether or not entries have been done on-line.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 10. REFUSUAL OF ENTRIES: Entries of persons suspended or expelled from the Federation will be refused. The Management has the right to refuse entries of an exhibitor or participation of any rider, Owner, Trainer or Coach who has shown objectionable attitude or behavior at a recognized competition towards its management, which management is able to substantiate, or previous unsportsmanlike behavior at a Recognized Competition which management is able to substantiate.
- 11. PRIZES AND AWARDS: Ribbon will be awarded 1st through 5th place for all Divisions, Open, Adult Amateur, Junior/Young Rider.
- 12. MINOR EXHIBITORS: Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors shall hold Greystone Equestrian Center, Cadence Equestrian Events, USEF, USDF harmless for injury to such minor. No child's entry blank shall be accepted unless it is signed by a parent or guardian. The signature of instructors, agents, or other unrelated persons will not be accepted.
- 13. MANAGEMENT: The management reserves the right to itself interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or rising out of or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the horse show management and its decision will be final.
- 14. RETURNED CHECK: Checks returned by the bank for any reason will be handled as follows; All returned checks will be charged an additional 10% penalty (\$25.00 minimum). Accounts will be given 10 days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be turned into the USEF for further disciplinary action.
- 15. STABLING: Stabling is available at a cost of \$100.00 (Friday- Monday). No services are included. Please supply your own bedding and food. Permanent stalls 14' x 14', Corrals and temporary stalls are available on a first come, first served basis. All stalls have wooden doors.
- 16. GROUNDS: Exhibitors may park (car and trailer) only in specified areas. **Absolutely no dogs allowed on show grounds.** Bring your own chairs, seating is limited. Only those horses entered in the show will be permitted in the competition and warm-up areas during the competition.
- 17. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of a licensed competition. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for person with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
- 18. ARENAS: Plaster sand Footing is used in the competition and on-deck arenas. Competition Arenas are 20×60 meter. Riding warm-up 20×60 meter sand footing. Longing warm-up sand footing. Competitors may have access to all arenas Friday before the competition if stabled on show grounds.
- 19. MUSIC: Must be provided by competitors. Management is not responsible for poor quality music media. All music must be clearly marked. CD's will be accepted.

- 22. LODGING: Limited onsite apartments available and RV space. Email Carolyn at whimby4@aol.com to reserve apartment or RV space.

(the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likemesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, uport, or the Federation. Those likemesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

Federation Release, Assumption of Risk, Waiver, and Indemnification This document waives important legal rights. Read it carefully before signing.

- I AGREE in consideration for my participation in this Competition to the following: I AGREE that "the Federation" and "Competition" as used herein includes the Licensee and Competition Management, as well as all of their officials, officers, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers and Federation affiliates
- I AGREE that I choose to participate voluntarily in the Competition with my horse, as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, trainer, or as parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor. I am fully aware and acknowledge that horse sports and the Competition involve inherent dangerous risks of accident, loss, and serious bodily injury including broken bones, head injuries, trauma, pain, suffering, or death. ("Harm").
- I AGREE to hold harmless and release the Federation and the Competition from all claims for money damages or otherwise for any Harm to me or my horse and for any Harm of any nature caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm arises or results, directly or indirectly, from the negligence of the Federation or the Competition.
- I AGREE to expressly assume all risks of Harm to me or my horse, including Harm resulting from the negligence of the Federation or the Competition.
