

Rider Education Corner Lessons Learned: It's not if but when! Always wear riding gear. By Bill Fischer

On July 21st, at 9:30am I left my home in Spicewood on the Goldwing to run some errands in Austin. I was on Hwy 71, a four lane highway, heading east bound running about 70 mph and had just moved into the left lane of traffic to pass some slower traffic in the right lane. I checked my mirror to




see if I could move back to the right lane and as I looked up the truck in front of me abruptly swerved to the right lane. I then saw that a car had stopped to turn left into a neighborhood called Paleface Ranch. I could not move to the right lane due to traffic so I did an emergency stop. I had the brakes locked and when I could not stop in time to avoid the car I laid the motorcycle down on it's left side. I went down hard on my left hip, then I came off the bike and slid to the left rear of the car and came to a stop looking up at the gas tank. The bike hit the right rear of the car causing heavy damage to the front of the motorcycle. I was able to stand up and pick up my bike with the help of a man who stopped to help and we moved the bike to the shoulder of the highway and a short time later the ambulance arrived along with Travis County Sheriff's Deputy.

The EMT's looked me over and took my vitals and said I was OK and I declined to be transported to the emergency room. A wrecker showed up on the scene and loaded my motorcycle. I called Joanie and she came to the scene. Joanie and I unloaded our stuff off the bike before they took it away.

She then took me to Brackenridge Hospital and I walked into the ER and was immediately escorted to be examined. X-rays showed that I had no broken bones and no lacerations were found. I had on my full face helmet that protected my head and it only appeared to have received minor scuff marks on the left side from impact with the pavement. I wore a ballistic jacket and pants that protected me from receiving any "road rash" and just to think I was not going to bother wearing the riding pants this time.

The lessons I want to share with others is that you may not always see things in time to avoid them and if you go down on your motorcycle without the right gear on you may find yourself with lot more injuries than you would have had due to wearing the right gear. I know all of you have seen a time that someone in front of you saw something in the road such as a piece of furniture, an animal or other large debris and swerved to miss
